
THE HOLY SPIRIT IS GOD

Our God is one God, but there are three persons in the Godhead. There is God the Father, God the Son, and God the Holy Spirit. That is why we sometimes refer to God as the Holy Trinity.

In today's passage, we learn that the Spirit of God moved upon the face of the waters. In the work of creation, all three persons of the Godhead were working together. God the Father was there when heaven and earth was created. We hear His voice saying, "Let there be light: and there was light" (v. 3). In John 1:3, when referring to Jesus, the living Word, "All things were made by him; and without him was not any thing made that was made." Thus the Bible teaches us that the Holy Spirit is God, just as Jesus is God.

As God, the Holy Spirit is in substance, equal in power and glory with the Father and the Son. No one should say that God the Father is more powerful than God the Son or God the Spirit. The Bible teaches that they are not only equal in power but also equal in glory.

In church, after the offering has been collected, we stand to sing this hymn. Notice that we praise the Triune God.

Praise God, from whom all blessings flow;

Praise Him, all creatures here below;

Praise Him above, ye heavenly host;

Praise Father, _____ and _____.

Because we usually pay less attention to the Holy Spirit, we sometimes forget about Him. This month, we will learn more about this third person of the Holy Trinity, and hopefully we will be more conscious of the ministry of the Holy Spirit then.

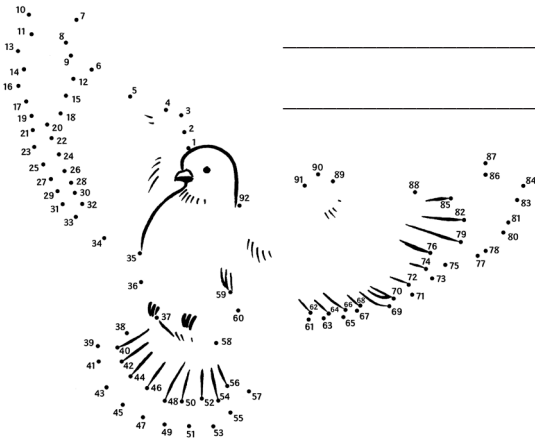
Thought: The Holy Spirit is God.

Prayer: Heavenly Father, thank You for the reminder that the Holy Spirit is an important and equal member of the Godhead. May I learn to appreciate His ministry and to love Him as much as I love You and Jesus. This I pray in Jesus' name, Amen.

THE HOLY SPIRIT IS GENTLE

John the Baptist in today’s Bible reading tells us about the baptism of Jesus. John knew that Jesus was, “The Lamb of God, which taketh away the sin of the world” (v29). The Holy Spirit was working in John to reveal the deep things of God. It was also the Holy Spirit that descended from heaven like a dove and rested upon the Lord Jesus Christ. So not only was John bearing record, the Holy Spirit was also telling us that Jesus is the Son of God.

Why did the Holy Spirit come down in the form of a dove, and not another type of bird, perhaps one more powerful like the eagle or hawk? Although the Holy Spirit is as powerful as God the Father or Jesus, his gentle side is to be considered here. If you are a believer, the Holy Spirit will be in you. He will guide you and prompt you gently in life.

Sometimes when you are naughty or rude, do you feel the Holy Spirit prompting you to change? Or when you have been selfish or proud, do you feel Him gently nudging you to repent?

Thought: May I be sensitive to the prompting of the Holy Spirit.

Prayer: Heavenly Father, fill me with thy Spirit, so that I may be more sensitive to Him, and eventually have a closer walk with Thee. This I pray in Jesus’ name, Amen.

LIFE-GIVING POWER OF THE SPIRIT

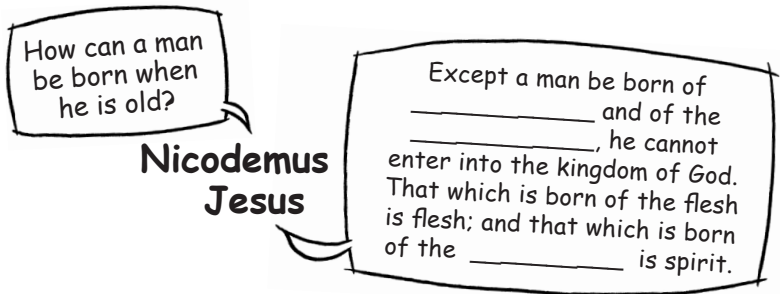
The life-giving power of the Spirit is taught in Christ's conversation with Nicodemus. No one can enter into the kingdom of God by his own efforts. No matter how good one is, or how hard one works, he or she is still not good enough to enter God's kingdom.

Only the Spirit of God can bring about a new spiritual birth to a person. The Holy Spirit works in a quiet, non-showy way, making a man repent of his sins, recognising he is a sinner, and having him put his faith and trust in Jesus. A child like you can also come to Jesus, if the Holy Spirit so chooses and works in you.

Another time, Jesus told someone that the Holy Spirit is needed for conversion is when he spoke with the Samaritan woman in John 4. In that passage, he mentioned that whosoever drinks the water He gives shall never thirst again. What does that mean?

This water from Jesus is not water that we can see or touch. It is the powerful work of grace, the invisible life-giving power of the Spirit that gives eternal, everlasting life to the believer.

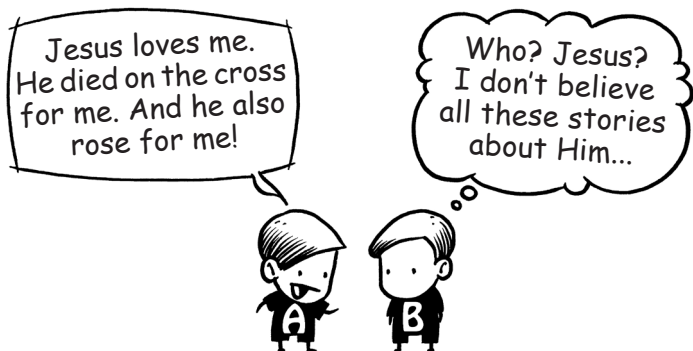
THE HOLY SPIRIT IS OUR TEACHER

We all have teachers. Some are nice and some, nasty, but most will like a teacher who can teach well in a gentle way. Today, we shall learn that the Holy Spirit is exactly that – a wonderful teacher who is gentle at the same time.

These two verses teach that all spiritual knowledge is given to us by God through His Spirit. We ourselves are unable to know spiritual truths unless God through His Holy Spirit reveals them. The Holy Spirit has infinite knowledge of all things. He is all knowing, as He is God, and God is all knowing.

This does not mean the Holy Spirit teaches you about Science or the languages. For that, we have our school teachers and tutors. What he will teach us are the deep things of the Lord. For anyone to know he is a sinner and to repent, he has to be taught by the Holy Spirit.

THE HOLY SPIRIT PRAYS FOR US, AND HELPS US PRAY

The Holy Spirit comes into us the moment we believe in Jesus, and He strengthens believers along the way. He helps us when we are sad, perhaps when our friends reject the gospel or even laugh at us. We are often “infirm” or weak and we cannot take sufferings or disappointments but the Holy Spirit will console us and enable us to bear with our trials. On top of that, the Holy Spirit prays for us, and helps us to pray!

Sometimes we are so lost or in such trouble that we do not know how to pray, or what to pray for. Left to ourselves, we are often unable to bear the burden, nor sometimes, even know what to ask from God. We want to pray, but we do not know what words to say. Our hearts are heavy, but our lips are empty. In times like these, the Holy Spirit comes and assists us to pray.

How does the Holy Spirit help us pray? He may remind us of certain things to pray for. He may also prompt us to pray for some loved ones who may not be saved. At times, He could also pray for us when we do not even say anything. These could be times when we are not able to express our difficulties or troubles.

Thank God we, as Singaporeans, live in a safe and prosperous country. However, many children in the world do not have this privilege. Think about children in war-torn countries, places where hygiene standards are low, or where the crime rate is high. At times, children like these may not know what to say when in fear. If you have ever come across a very difficult situation, be assured that the Lord fully understands and the Holy Spirit will help you pray, as well as pray for you!

Thought: What a wonderful prayer partner we have in the Holy Spirit!

Prayer: Heavenly Father, thank You for the gift of the Holy Spirit. For such a wonderful companion and faithful prayer warrior who aids me in my spiritual life and prayer life, I am grateful. This I pray in Jesus' name, Amen.

GRIEVE NOT THE HOLY SPIRIT

We grieve our parents when we are disobedient. Despite their many reminders to us, we sometimes do not study hard, and want things our own way. How do we not grieve mummy and daddy? Simple – obey them and do what they tell us, or do what we know they would like us to do.

Like our parents, the Holy Spirit has feelings and can be hurt. We grieve Him when we sin and do anything against what He wants us to do. What can these be? Well, many! Being angry or unreasonable when we do not get what we want is something all humans do, adults or children. Or lying. Or being unkind to others. Or gossiping. There are just so many ways we may grieve the Holy Spirit. May the Lord teach us to live such a life that will not grieve Him.

The Holy Spirit in the soul of a believer is God’s seal, set on his heart to testify that he is God’s property and belongs to God. To sin against God is not only to pollute our souls but also to rebel against the Spirit of God. Take a minute and pray about the things you may have done that grieved the Holy Spirit. Ask the Lord for forgiveness, and commit these areas to Him, trusting that He will help you overcome them.

THE HOLY SPIRIT, THE GIVER

When we love someone, we want to give good gifts to that person. Your parents love you dearly, and they would have given to you the gift of time, attention, love, care, on top of the physical items they have showered on you in the past. And when we receive gifts, we are grateful, should we not be?

The Holy Spirit is no different – He loves to give gifts to those He loves! He gives to all as He pleases. However, he does not grant the same blessings to all, as all of us need and use different gifts.

Thus to some, He gives the gift of teaching (pastors, Sunday School teachers), others the gift of drawing (do you know who has been drawing the beautiful illustrations for the Junior RPG?), and yet to others the gift of generosity and perhaps singing. The Holy Spirit knows that different gifts are needed for different occasions.

There are three things to note today.

Firstly, all Christians have been given gifts. You too. You have been given at least one gift. What is that gift? You should find out and use it. If you are not sure, ask your parents or friends what you are strong in.

Secondly, as these gifts are given by God, we should never be proud or conceited. Some may think it is their merit that they are able to accomplish certain things. That is both dangerous and foolish thinking, and can cause Christians to forget the Giver.

Thirdly, if we are not to be proud, we must be grateful to the Lord. Gratitude is a neglected virtue, but it is a very important one. But how can we demonstrate gratitude? Use these gifts for the glory of God! And if people praise us for whatever gifts we have, tell them they are from the Lord!

Thought: Use your gift wisely and humbly.

Prayer: Heavenly Father, I please let me discover the gift You gave. And please Heavenly Father, teach me to use it for Thy sake and for Thy glory. In Jesus' name I pray, Amen.

THE MINISTRY OF THE HOLY SPIRIT

In this passage, Jesus talks about the personal presence of the Spirit in every believer. His invisible presence, although not seen, can be felt in a powerful way if we maintain a close walk with the Lord.

Jesus made it clear in verse 15, "If ye love me, keep my commandments." We must love God and show that by keeping his commandments. Should we do that, the ministry of the Holy Spirit will be a powerful one in our lives. And just as Jesus was the comforter of the disciples when He was on earth, the Holy Spirit will be our Comforter today!

The Holy Spirit indwells the believer, and that means He is always there to comfort, counsel and guide the believer. Since He abides in us, He will always be there for us. He will not forsake us or abandon us even when we sin. What we must be aware of is that He is in us, and that we must be sensitive to His teachings and promptings. When we sin, we must feel bad and miserable as we would have grieved the Holy Spirit. Then, He will work within us to change us, to move us away from the ways of sin to the ways of righteousness. This is the work of the Holy Spirit.

HOLY SPIRIT WILL CONVICT YOU OF SIN!

“I didn’t mean to scratch your skateboard, Karen! You don’t have to get so mad!” Jared defended himself. “I told you to leave it alone!” sputtered Karen. “Well, a skateboard is meant to jump and ride rails and stuff,” muttered Jared. “All you do is coast down the street on it. Why don’t you try out this ramp I built?”

Just then, their father came. “Look, Dad!” exclaimed Karen. “Jared got all these scratches on my new skateboard. I told him not to take it on that ramp, but he wouldn’t listen. He messed it all up!”

“I couldn’t help it, Karen – I didn’t fall on purpose,” said Jared quickly. “Besides, look what happened to my shirt when I fell off the board. There are grass stains all over it!”

“Well, Karen,” said Dad as he examined the skateboard, “the other day, you showed me a bunch of decals you’ve been collecting. If you use them to cover most of those scratches, the board will look great! I’ll help you with it, okay?” Karen looked relieved. Then Dad turned to Jared. “Do you want some white paint to put over those stains on your shirt?”

“Paint!” exclaimed Jared. “Of course not! These stains will have to be washed out, not covered up.”

“I agree,” said Dad, “but do you know that you shouldn’t cover up the wrong things you have done? You shouldn’t have scratched Karen’s skateboard, and we’re making the best of it with the sticker idea. But instead of accepting your responsibility and apologising, you made excuses. You even made yourself a victim by complaining about your shirt. You were trying to cover up the wrong thing you did, weren’t you?”

“Well, I... I guess so,” admitted Jared. “I... I’m sorry, Karen.”

Thought: When you’ve done something wrong, do you accept responsibility?

Prayer: Heavenly Father, please teach me never to look for someone else to blame when I do wrong. Give me the courage to obey the Holy Spirit’s guidance to confess my sins and to admit my mistakes. That’s far better than making excuses or blaming others for what I’ve done. This I pray in Jesus’ name, Amen.

LOVE – THE FRUIT OF THE HOLY SPIRIT

What is your favourite fruit? In a tropical country like ours, it is easy to find a large variety of fruits. And with modern technology and transportation, fruits grown in cold countries may also be readily found here.

Today and the next 8 days, we will spend some time talking about a fruit. However, it is no ordinary fruit for it is the fruit of the Holy Spirit. This is one fruit, but it has many components to it, all good, all different, yet all linked. We will also concentrate on just 2 verses for these nine days and learn in depth what they mean.

The fruit of the Spirit happens when the work and word of God is effective in your life. The completion of this fruit will take time, but the end result is beautiful. But what is this fruit? The verse tells us clearly, it is love. Love has 8 parts, each of which we will examine on a daily basis. For today, let us focus on love.

This word “Love” is from the Greek word “Agape”. This is not the nice temporary feeling some may feel, or the romantic kind of love one may see on television. Agape love is the purest form of love, a tough and wonderful love that can only be seen and tasted if a person first experiences it from God.

This type of love is the highest and greatest kind of love. At the point a person experiences salvation, he will first experience true love from God. This forgiveness comes at a tremendously high price, for Jesus had to die on the cross to secure that forgiveness. That describes in a way what agape love is. Agape love is sacrificial, kind, and generous.

Do you have this kind of love? Are you able to love others in that way? Frankly, it is not easy to have this kind of love. In fact, it is impossible to have this kind of love, unless it is the Holy Spirit that empowers you to do so. That is why it is called the fruit of the Holy Spirit, not the fruit of the believer. How would this kind of fruit be reflected in our lives? By the careful growth and nurturing of the various aspects of this love. And it will take time! Remember, the fruit is the evidence that the Holy Spirit is in you. Do you see such a fruit in your life?

Thought: May I have this wonderful fruit of agape love!

Prayer: Heavenly Father, thank You for the fruit of the Holy Spirit. May I learn how to slowly grow and nurture this fruit by constantly learning more and more to be like Jesus. In His name I pray, Amen.

JOY – PART OF LOVE, FRUIT OF THE HOLY SPIRIT

The first aspect of love, the fruit of the Holy Spirit, is joy. Real Christians can always have joy in their hearts because of what the Lord Jesus has done for them, and what the Holy Spirit can do through them. This joy is not a sense of delight when things turn our way. It is the awareness that God, who gave us the guarantee of His enduring presence, is always there for us.

Real joy comes from knowing who you are – that you are the child of the Almighty God. And that you can turn to the Holy Spirit for help anytime. Real joy comes from loving the Lord, from communion with Him, from spending time on digging into His word, from not being unhappy by things on earth.

Are you joyful? Take a look at the people around you: your family, schoolmates, teachers, and friends. Are they joyful people? Sadly, many are not. Unfortunately, a lot of people are burdened and weighed down with the problems of this world. As believers in Jesus, we have the Holy Spirit and He will grant us joy as the first aspect of the fruit He can bless us with. So be a joyful you!

Many in the world cannot be joyful because they are without Jesus. And some, even believers, do not have the right level of joy because they may forget to trust God for all they need.

The secret of real Christian Joy – is to keep our eyes focused on Jesus. That does not mean looking at a picture of what Jesus may look like from some children's bible or painting. Keeping our eyes focused on Jesus means to always think of Him, to be a prayerful child, to trust Him to provide for you and your family, and to live a life for Him. In turn, that will keep us happy in the things that will make Jesus happy, and surely one of the things that makes Jesus very happy is the fact that we have eternal life through Him! You will recall the chorus, "Turn your eyes upon Jesus – look full in His wonderful face. And the things of earth will grow strangely dim, in the light of his glory and grace."

Thought: May I turn my eyes upon Jesus, and be a joyful child!

Prayer: Heavenly Father, thank You for teaching me that joy is such an important part of my life. I know that at times, I may not have been as joyful as I ought to be. Perhaps it is because I do not commit all my problems to You. Perhaps it is because I lack a little faith. So Heavenly Father, please teach me to surrender my life to You, and I will be able to experience joy. In Jesus' name I pray, Amen.

PEACE – PART OF LOVE, FRUIT OF THE HOLY SPIRIT

There is a true account of a very wealthy and powerful American called Sandy Weill. Mr. Weill was the head of a big international bank for many years. When he retired in 2006, he revealed he has not been sleeping every Sunday night for almost 50 years! Asked why, he said he was thinking of the next day when he had to go back to work, and was fearful of what could go wrong in his large empire.

If a person has peace, he would be able to sleep well. Clearly Mr. Weill did not have peace, at least not on many Sunday nights. Psalm 127:2 tells us it is the Lord who grants good sleep, “It is vain for you to rise up early, to sit up late, to eat the bread of sorrows: for so he giveth his beloved sleep.” Is it strange that such a wealthy man does not possess peace? No.

Real peace comes only from God, not from possession of money or power or position in life. The richest man in the world may not have the peace a child like you have, because you may have what he does not have – the Holy Spirit!

Would you like to have this peace? It is simple – commit yourself to the Lord and ask Him to grant you more of that! God doesn’t even want you to try to obtain peace in your own strength. He wants to grow peace in you, and He does that when you spend time with Him. Just as you are influenced by other kids when you spend time with them and become like them, you are influenced by God when you spend time with Him and become like Him.

You can spend time with God by reading the Junior RPG and the Bible, and listening to what He wants to say to you. You also spend time with Him when you pray to Him or during family devotions. Knowing more of God’s Word and His will for us can only give us more peace as we will be better able to trust Him and know that He cares.

Without the peace of the Holy Spirit in your life, you can become easily shaken and disturbed. Dear child, seek the Lord and ask Him to grant more peace to you, your family, and other loved ones.

Thought: Only God can give real peace.

Prayer: Heavenly Father, giver of peace and restful sleep, I thank You for granting me the Holy Spirit. May I continue to be faithful in reading and obeying Thy word so that I will be able to get more peace. Praying too for my family and loved ones, that to them You will also grant peace. In Jesus’ name I pray, Amen.

LONGSUFFERING – PART OF LOVE, FRUIT OF THE HOLY SPIRIT

What is longsuffering? The word longsuffering in Greek is made up of two words, “long” and “anger.” Together, it means the ability of a person to hold one’s anger for a long, long time. In other words, such a person is said to be long-tempered. He is slow to anger. This is directly opposite to a person who is short-tempered. A person who is longsuffering shows patience, forbearance towards others and will not avenge wrongs. Longsuffering is that quality of self-restraint when in the face of provocation does not hastily retaliate or promptly punish. It does not give tit for tat when hurt or angered by others. We need to be longsuffering in our interaction with people.

Longsuffering is part of God’s character. Both in the Old Testament and the New Testament, whenever God is said to be longsuffering, the context often deals with man’s repentance and salvation. It has to do with God’s mercy towards men. In the Psalms, God is often described as being slow to anger and plenteous in mercy. There are many examples shown in the Bible of God’s longsuffering towards men. God is our example of longsuffering.

Are you facing difficult people in your life? They may be your classmates in school who do not like you and do things that irritate you. Should you react in anger and shout at them? Certainly not! The Bible tells us to be longsuffering. So what should we do? Turn to the Lord. You see, because we are Christians, we have the Holy Spirit in us. Having the Holy Spirit, we will also have the fruit of the Holy Spirit which includes the virtue of longsuffering. When we pray and turn to the Lord, He will give us strength to endure difficult people in our lives.

Thought: Longsuffering is part of God’s character.

Prayer: Heavenly Father, help me to be longsuffering when I face difficult people. Help me to bear a good testimony by not retaliating and reacting in anger. May I follow your example of being longsuffering. This I pray in Jesus’ name, Amen.

GENTLENESS – PART OF LOVE, FRUIT OF THE HOLY SPIRIT

Have you heard people quarrelling? I am sure you have. But have you heard Have you heard people quarrelling? I am sure you have. But have you heard people quarrelling softly? That is unlikely to happen. When people quarrel, they usually raise their voices and are anything but gentle! Through their raised voices, they may irritate each other, and raise their voices further! If people remember to speak softly even if they disagree, the frequency of quarrels will decrease!

Today we examine an aspect of the fruit of the Holy Spirit that is not often pursued as a virtue or strength to have – gentleness. Gentleness is submission to God's will. It is when our selfish nature is tamed by the Lord Himself, when we learn how to show appreciation to the Lord by demonstrating his goodness to others. When we are aware that we have to represent God on earth, we will want to put on the best behaviour for our Saviour. We do not want to be the opposite of gentle – that is to be rude, or rough, or mean, or unkind, or cruel. You may have come across classmates who are like that – rude or mean. Imagine one of them trying to witness for Jesus to a non-Christian child. What a bad testimony that would be!

Another aspect of gentleness is to be considerate of others. When you love someone, you will be considerate of this person. See how gentle mothers are to infants, carrying them and whispering to them in soft, kind voices. We are taught to love each other and thus, we are also to be gentle to each other. Many people mistake gentleness for weakness. Nothing is further from the truth. Jesus was gentle to children and the poor and seeking, but He was and still is the almighty God who created heaven and earth!

Do you speak gently to your friends, especially to those who are slower than you, or not as smart as you, or do not understand as many things as you do?

Dear child, learn and love gentleness. Through gentleness, you will avoid unhappiness. Through gentleness, you will know what real strength is.

Thought: May I learn and love gentleness.

Prayer: Heavenly Father, perhaps I have not been a gentle child in the past. Please teach me gentleness that I may be a better witness for Thee. In Jesus' name I pray, Amen.

GOODNESS – PART OF LOVE, FRUIT OF THE HOLY SPIRIT

Goodness is a quality in us that will put a smile on others. In turn, this goodness given by God will lead sinners to repentance if they see that in you.

This particular quality has a real drawing power to it. Spirit-filled believers who possess goodness are like a magnet. Many people who have been saved through an individual believer say that what drew them was the love and goodness they saw shining through that believer.

Christians can effectively witness to others by just living right and being a good example and role model for others to follow. Many nonbelievers carefully observe Christians because they know there is something different about them.

Goodness in a person gets deep down into the core of a believer's personality. To those who really have this quality, you can tell that it is something operating deep down inside of them. You can see it, and feel it when you get around people filled with goodness. We are not talking about someone who is nice on the outside but not nice inside. There are many people like that. These are hypocrites who pretend to be nice and good. Or they are nice only to people who are important or useful to them. That is not the fruit of the Holy Spirit; that is the fruit of someone selfish who plans to be good only to selected people they can use. That is not what the bible is teaching; we are to be good to all around us.

Being good also means we are ready to do good, not just talk about doing good. There are some who talk more than they do; the idea here is for believers who are filled with the Holy Spirit to do what they say, instead of just saying the right things.

Are you a good child? Do you show to your parents, siblings, teachers and classmates you have this quality in you? Are they pleased with your behaviour? Do you speak kindly and are you an unselfish child?

Thought: May others know me as a good child!

Prayer: Heavenly Father, I confess that at times, I have not been good. At times, I have been naughty or unkind or just not nice. But Heavenly Father, You know I want to be good. So please forgive me of my sins and help me to learn to be a good child. I pray that as I transform and improve, others can see the changes in me. In Jesus' name I pray, Amen.

FAITH – PART OF LOVE, FRUIT OF THE HOLY SPIRIT

What is faith? One way is to think of “faith” as 5 words, each beginning with the letters of the word faith: For All I Trust Him. Of course, the “Him” refers to our precious Lord. That essentially is faith, for faith is belief in God and what He promises. Do you have faith? Do you really believe in God and have this simple trust in Him? Do you trust Him for all things? Faith is trusting in Him even if things go wrong. Faith is, as the classic chapter on Faith in Hebrews 11 teaches us, the substance of things hoped for, the evidence of things not seen.

The closer we are to God, the more we read the bible and maintain our Quiet Time, the more faith we will have. Dear child, the Christian walk is a wonderful thing but we must have faith. Even if we cannot see God, we know He is real. Although we may not know a lot of the bible since we are young, all children have what it takes to be close to God, and that something is this quiet confidence in God that He will take care of us. Do you have faith in God? Do you pray to Him and really trust Him to help you?

There was this story of a village in Korea that was invaded by enemies who were haters of God. They rounded the villagers, known for their belief in Jesus. The enemy made a crude wooden cross and placed it in the center of the circle where the villagers gathered. Then they announced: “If you want to live, you will have to renounce your faith in Jesus, then come to the center and spit at the cross!” No one moved. Then the leader of the enemies had an evil plan – force the pastor to first do it and that will break the will of the people. Turning their attention to the pastor, they pointed a gun at his head and told him to betray Jesus. Confused and lacking confidence in God, the pastor did the cowardly thing and spat at the cross. The crowd was shocked! How could the pastor do it! But one by one, the others followed. If the pastor could do it to save his life, the rest could too.

It was the children’s turn next. A little girl proceeded to the cross and did something that stunned the rest to silence, then tears. Instead of spitting at the cross, she cradled it in her arms, and wiped it clean with her clothes. It was told that the act of faith so touched the enemies they released the entire village.

Thought: Would I have the faith of this little girl?

Prayer: Heavenly Father, I know my faith in You may be small. But please teach me to grow in my faith. In Jesus’ name I pray, Amen.

MEEKNESS – PART OF LOVE, FRUIT OF THE HOLY SPIRIT

What is meekness? It is strength under control; it is submission of ourselves to God. Many may associate meekness for weakness. However, that is not accurate.

Guess who is the meekest man in the bible? It was the great leader of the Jews – Moses. As leader of 2 million of God’s people, he was in a powerful position and yet the bible tells us he was very meek. Why? Because a believer knows that on his own, he is nothing. And because his reliance is completely on God, he cannot but be meek. Moses knew that although he was made leader of the Jews, he did nothing to earn that.

Meekness is very similar to humility, and humility is such a rare virtue. Many are proud. Some of your classmates may be; I hope you are not. When you do well in a test or examination, do you go around asking others how well they fared? Even if you do not mean to be proud, you may appear to be so. In times like these, you have to be sensitive to weaker students and be meek and humble about your achievements.

Do you know how tall the tallest building in Singapore is? 280 metres is the answer. There are 3 buildings in Singapore that are 280 metres tall: UOB Plaza, Republic Plaza, OUB Centre. But which building in Singapore has the deepest piling? Do people know about this less-popular aspect of buildings? Do people care about how deep pilings go? Very few? Why? Because buildings are seen and admired for their towering presence than for their deep pilings. In a way, meekness is like piling. No one really cares about it. But we all know that if a building does not have deep piling, it cannot be built tall. Likewise, if we are not meek, our “spiritual piling” will not be deep enough for us to build strong Christian characters for ourselves.

The true believer knows that he is a sinner bound for hell and would go there had it not been for the grace of God through Jesus. He would have the faith (remember “For All I Trust Him”) in Jesus, and not in himself or herself. Therefore, a true believer cannot but be meek and humble.

Thought: How deep is your “spiritual piling”?

Prayer: Heavenly Father, please remind me that on my own, I can do nothing. I know all I have and am is from Thee, so to Thee I must be grateful. Help me also to have meekness, for it is part of the fruit of the Holy Spirit. In Jesus’ name I pray, Amen.

TEMPERANCE – PART OF LOVE, FRUIT OF THE HOLY SPIRIT

Temperance looks like a big word. What is it really? Temperance is the self-control and self-discipline you can see in a Christian as a result of the Holy Spirit's control of him. This aspect of the fruit of the Holy Spirit is placed last not because it is least important. It is placed last as it is the crowning glory of a Christian. It is the ability of the believer to be balanced; to be humble in victory, and strong in defeat. That is when the believer knows his life is in the hands of God, and that as he follows God's will, there is nothing the Father in heaven will not take care of. That is temperance; that is a complete faith in the gracious God!

How can we see temperance? Perhaps when you do well in school, you will be balanced and not show off your grades to everyone. When you do not do well, you will not be disappointed, but trust in the Lord, and work extra hard for the next round. You are at peace, whether circumstances around you are positive or negative. Temperance is not something that just happens out of the blue. Temperance is a result of the Holy Spirit filling, and is often what a Christian will be after he has the other aspects of the fruit of the Spirit. These are aspects we have studied in the past week. You see, when you have joy, and peace, and long-suffering... you will have temperance.

Temperance is also a sign of a maturing Christian. It does not mean that you, as a child, cannot have temperance. Temperance can be yours when you grow slowly in the faith as a child of God, when you slowly cultivate the fruit of the Spirit. Think of it as growing an actual tree. There is no way one can speed up the growth of the tree even if the best care is given. Likewise, temperance is the result of a long and stable relationship with the Lord.

The opposite of temperance is seen in people who are easily affected by things or events around them. Like waves tossed about in strong winds, these people may swing from elation to extreme sadness, always subject to the situation around them. Dear child, pray for temperance, that the Lord will grant you the inner balance that is there because you trust in God and know your life is in His hands.

Thought: May I be a child with temperance!

Prayer: Heavenly Father, thank You for granting the fruit of the Holy Spirit to Your children. I know I fail many times to demonstrate these different aspects of the fruit, but Lord, please help me to always remember to try to have them. This I pray in Jesus' name, Amen.

THE CONVICTING WORK OF THE HOLY SPIRIT (1)

Imagine there is a junior worship Christmas celebration where new friends are invited. The Gospel is preached and two boys hear the same message. One believes but the other does not. Why is this so? It is the convicting work of the Holy Spirit on the one who believes; the Holy Spirit will help that person to understand how great and grievous his sins are. The other boy, whose heart hardened, will not be convicted of his sins because he refuses to believe he has sins or that his sins will condemn him.

For the first boy, the Holy Spirit will open his spiritual eyes and give him faith to believe. Faith is a gift of God. Faith will enable him to realise the love and sacrifice of God's only begotten Son on the cross. He will come humbly and give his heart to the Lord who loved and died for him. There might be tears, tears of repentance for his bad behaviour and tears thinking of Christ's great love for a sinner such as he is. All this is the convicting work of the Holy Spirit.

The Holy Spirit also convicts believers of sin and wrong-doing when we are close to Him. Sometimes, when you pray or read the Bible, are you not touched by the grace of our Lord? When you are moved to be a better Christian, to have a more consistent Quiet Time, to be more like Jesus, all these are the convicting work of the Spirit.

THE CONVICTING WORK OF THE HOLY SPIRIT (2)

The Bible clearly teaches that the special convicting work of the Spirit will lead to the salvation of the soul. This saving work of the Spirit is wholly mysterious to us. It surpasses our human understanding and reasoning. And whether a person is wealthy or educated has no bearing on his salvation at all.

The writer thought that her educated father would first come to believe in Jesus when the gospel was brought to him, but it was her illiterate mother who joyfully came to put her trust in Christ. Though Father came later to the Lord, Mother's faith had always been much stronger.

You may have heard of the American hymn lyricist Fanny Crosby. Although she became blind shortly after birth, she penned almost 8,000 hymns and choruses for the Lord. Though blind, she led many to "see" God in the beautiful words of her compositions. One famous hymn is entitled "Pass Me Not" and the words remind us of today's lesson – the convicting work of the Holy Spirit.

*Pass me not, O gentle Savior,
Hear my humble cry;
While on others Thou art calling,
Do not pass me by.*

Chorus

*Savior, Savior, Hear my humble cry;
While on others Thou art calling, Do not pass me by.
Let me at Thy throne of mercy, Find a sweet relief;
Kneeling there in deep contrition; Help my unbelief.
Trusting only in Thy merit, Would I seek Thy face;
Heal my wounded, broken spirit, Save me by Thy grace.*

Thought: Pass me not, O precious Saviour!

Prayer: Heavenly Father, thank You for choosing me as your child. Help me to understand it is such a blessing to have been convicted of my sins and to be able to now cast all my burdens unto You. I pray for some of my loved ones who are not saved that Thou O Lord will also be merciful to convict them with the Holy Spirit. This I pray, in Jesus' name, Amen.

HE CAN GUIDE YOU!

Life can bring us challenges and difficulties that throw doubt along our way. Although our parents are wise and lead us in many ways, even they can be confused and not know what to do at times. That is why it is so wonderful to have the Holy Spirit because He will guide believers. He will teach them to make right decisions, He will guide them to understand His Word.

However, the Holy Spirit's guidance is not through dreams or visions, but by His convicting of our hearts and minds when we are close to God. It is crucial that the believer remains close to God for otherwise, he may think he is guided by the Holy Spirit when in reality, he is led by his own senses and priorities!

For us children, how can the Holy Spirit guide us?

You have to continue to do the basics: be faithful in reading the Word and doing your Quiet Time, value His precious Word and not treat it like some book written by human authors, go to the Lord daily in prayer seeking His blessings and protection, learn to shun evil or naughty friends who may lead you astray.

Dear child, may the Lord watch over and guide you!

There is a hymn of the US Navy asking God to guide and protect them. Entitled "Eternal Father, Strong to Save", some of the verses are below. Underline all sentences that call upon God to guide and protect His own.

Prayer: Heavenly Father, guide us, so that we may know what You want us to do. Help me to continue to keep close to You by the daily reading and obedience to Thy precious Word. This I pray in Jesus' name, Amen.

YOU ARE THE TEMPLE OF GOD!

Should a hotel owner know a very important person is going to be his hotel guest, he would ensure the whole hotel is cleaned up, and repairs made, to ensure it is in the best state to receive this very important guest. Why is this so? Because it is a great privilege to host this guest!

When this important guest comes, he must be given the best, and will surely be offered the most impressive suite available.

The same logic applies to us. When we say “We are the temple of God”, it means the Holy Ghost dwells in our body in the spiritual sense. Like the hotel owner who keeps his hotel clean, we have to ensure our body is kept in the best of condition, cleansed meticulously, so that it will live up to the honour of having the Holy Spirit live in us! In that case, we will become the “temple of God”.

Also, we invite the Holy Spirit to the most important “room”, and that is our heart! We invite God to stay there as the heart directs our lives and will affect all other organs of our body. If the heart is right, the entire body will be too. If the Holy Spirit is in our heart, we will allow Him to take control of our lives, and to live it the way He would have us to.

Should we be the temple of God, we will want to ensure we live to honour Him. The tongue is part of our body. If we use it to utter bad or unkind words, that would dishonour Him. Our feet are another part of our body. We should not join classmates or people who do not bring glory to God’s name by what they do.

There is this popular children’s song:

*O be careful little eyes what you see, O be careful little eyes what you see
 There’s a Father up above, And He’s looking down in love
 So, be careful little eyes what you see
 O be careful little feet where you go, O be careful little feet where you go
 There’s a Father up above, And He’s looking down in love
 So, be careful little feet where you go*

Thought: I must keep myself, the temple of God, clean for Him!

Prayer: Heavenly Father, teach me to keep my whole body pure and holy. I am so privileged to have You to be my Guest and I ask that You will guide and protect me. This I pray in the precious name of Jesus Christ, Amen.

THE FILLING OF THE HOLY SPIRIT

It is increasingly popular for people to drink wine or other alcoholic drinks. Wine appreciation courses are seen to be classy and fashionable. It is a fact that consumption of wine affects a person's judgement and emotions. So it is not surprising to read of drunk-driving accidents and how people get into fights and other kinds of trouble when drunk. All these result from people not taking control of themselves but allowing themselves to be controlled by alcohol.

The verse today warns believers not to be filled with wine but with the Holy Spirit. Clearly the idea is that Christians are to be filled with and controlled by the Holy Spirit and not be like drunkards who are controlled by alcohol.

To be filled with the Spirit, we must first be empty of ourselves. Think about it - before we can fill a bottle which is already full with Liquid Y, with Liquid X, the original content must first be emptied.

Likewise for us, we have to let ourselves decrease and let the Holy Spirit increase in our lives. That will mean we must confess and repent of our sins. Day by day, as we read God's Word, as we pray, the Holy Spirit will bring to remembrance the things we have done wrong. As soon as we know about them, we must quickly ask for forgiveness. No matter how big or how ugly the sin is, the Lord is faithful and just to forgive for He loves us.

Have you confessed these sins? Do it now.

- Telling lies about your homework, studies, results...
- Getting angry, scolding or being unkind...
- Being selfish and caring only for yourself...
- Being lazy and playing instead of studying and helping parents...

Thought: I must empty myself of sins so the Holy Spirit can fill me.

Prayer: Heavenly Father, I know I have sinned and for the Holy Spirit to fill me, I must first empty myself of sin, and wrong thoughts, and anything that will draw me away from Christ. Help me, Heavenly Father, for I pray humbly in Jesus' name, Amen.

FEEDING ON GOD'S WORD

Have you been to a delivery ward? Besides the faces of happy parents and excited relatives, you will also see and hear newborn babies crying. Why do they cry? Perhaps because their diapers are wet, or they may feel too cold or hot. There is one other possibility, and this happens to babies very often. What is it? All newborn babies crave milk. When they are hungry, they cry. What is the most yummy meal you have had? What is your favourite food? We are blessed to have so many types of food in Singapore; every culinary fantasy can be had: Italian, Indian, Korean, Nepalese, Turkish... the list goes on. All children like you will want to eat yummy food.

All humans will need and want food. Likewise, if we are spiritual children, we will crave spiritual milk or food, won't we? Do you feel the need to read God's Word and if you miss it for a day or two, will you feel something is not right? If so, that is good – you are clearly a child of God. But if not, why not? As a child will feel hungry without food for 2 days, a spiritual child will feel "hungry" without spiritual nourishment for a few days. To be a Spirit-filled Christian, we must also read the Bible daily and attend Sunday School.

When you are truly sorry for your sins, confess it to the Lord who will be merciful to forgive you. You must do it daily or regularly as we sin so easily. Confess, and then your heart will be cleansed and made pure and the Holy Spirit will fill your heart with joy and power. Isn't that wonderful?

To be filled with the Spirit, feed on God's Word. Your daily devotion of reading the Junior RPG and Bible will help you understand how to live a holy life pleasing to the Lord. That will in turn start to put in you the teachings of God's Word. The more of the bible's teachings you have in you, the more you will be filled with the Spirit as you will then tend to think the way God would.

Thought: Have you been having your daily spiritual feast?

Prayer: Heavenly Father, help me to love to read the Bible everyday. There are times when I forget or get plain lazy to read the Word, so please forgive me. Help me to be more serious about reading Thy Word so I can be strengthened. This I pray in Jesus' name, Amen.

SEALING OF THE SPIRIT

Have you ever been in an airport and noticed the difference between passengers who hold confirmed tickets and those who are on standby? The ones with confirmed tickets read newspapers, chat with their friends or sleep. The ones on standby hang around the ticket counter, pace back and forth and are clearly uneasy. The difference is a matter of confidence. The people with confirmed tickets have the assurance they will take the plane and reach their destination. This is similar to those who truly believe in God, and place their trust in Jesus, and today's verse reminds us, these will be sealed or guaranteed redemption. If we are tempted and stray from God, God is faithful to bring us back to Him one day. We will never lose our salvation if we are truly His. That is why people say, "Once saved, always saved." It is like you being a son or daughter of your parents, you will always be their child, no matter what you do. Likewise, once we accept Jesus as Lord and Savior, we are sealed the moment we become Christians.

However, although we are saved and sealed forever, we are told not to grieve the Holy Spirit. What does that mean? It means we cannot sadden the Holy Spirit by living a life of continuous and deliberate disobedience to God. There are some people who abuse the doctrine of "Once saved, always saved.", thinking they can still go to heaven while continuing to live in sin and disobedience. People who think like that are probably not saved in the first place. Why? Because a true believer, a real Christian, will be convicted of his sins and will want to please Jesus. Such a person will want to live a new life of victory over sin, and will not want to indulge in continuous and deliberate disobedience to God. Thus, it is very important that as we understand the concept of salvation, we must not grieve the Holy Spirit.

THANK GOD FOR HIS GIFTS!

When was the last time you had such a wonderful gift that caused you to grin from ear to ear? Whatever that was, you must have been elated (very happy). Today, there is more reason to grin! God loves to give us gifts and He is a generous heavenly Father!

All true believers in Christ will be blessed with at least one spiritual gift. In today's passage, we read of some of the gifts bestowed to the people in the time of Paul the Apostle. However, not all gifts are needed all the time, so some of those you read about would not be given today; these include miraculous healing, speaking in and interpretation of tongues, and prophecies. But many other types of gifts remain!

Why does God give gifts? For one, He wants to bless us. With the gifts He bestows, we are expected to use them to bless others. Imagine you give your mummy a lovely bookmark. You have put in a lot of effort making this bookmark and want to give it to her as a surprise. However, after she receives it, strangely she does not use it. Instead, she puts it in some corner and totally forgets about the bookmark. How would you feel? Would you like that feeling? Of course not! Your mummy will not do such a thing because she loves the giver of the bookmark, and as she loves you, she will also treasure what you give.

Do you love God? Are you thankful to Him for His gifts? If you love God, you will also love His gifts. And when you love His gifts, you will use them. We shall examine four different gifts over the next four days. But for today, there are two main lessons: firstly to be grateful to God for His gifts and secondly, that we may learn to use and strengthen these gifts!

Thought: Thank God for His gifts!

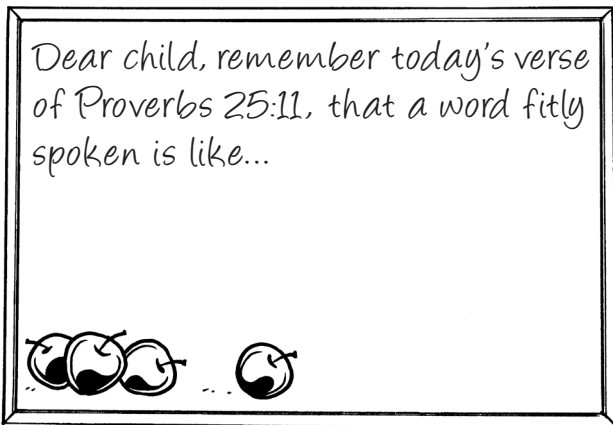
Prayer: Heavenly Father, I am so thankful that despite my sin and disobedience, You have given me gifts. I pray I will understand what they are and use them to glorify Thy name. This I pray in Jesus' name, Amen.

GIFT OF GODLY SPEECH

One gift of the Holy Spirit is the word of godly speech. A person given this gift will be able to speak carefully and wisely, with guidelines learnt from God's Word. Now usually, kids your age are not associated with wisdom. But dear child, if you are a child of the Lord, and if you really want to honour God in your life, one way to demonstrate that is to have godly speech! The Lord Jesus himself indicated clearly the tremendous significance of a man's words when he taught that evil words and good words should not come from the same person. His illustration was simple but true - a tree is known by its fruit and it will only bear one type of fruit; good or bad.

How to have godly speech? First of all, you must want to have that. Secondly, pray that God will help you understand the importance of godly speech. You may hear phrases like, "Oh, my goodness!" or worse, "Oh my God!", or other such phrases. Please do not think they sound "cool" in any way and therefore adopt them. Many who use such phrases may not even understand what they mean!

We are all very careful what goes into our mouths. We prefer to eat what we like and not what we do not wish to. If we are so vigilant about what goes in, how about what comes out of our mouth?



Thought: May my speech bring glory to God!

Prayer: Heavenly Father, help me to control my speech so that others can be encouraged by what they hear from me, and give me the courage to examine myself to see how I can improve in this area. This I pray in Jesus' name, Amen.

GIFT OF KINDNESS

We want to continue with the lesson on “Gifts of the Holy Spirit” today. Today’s verse is a wonderful reminder that we are to be kind, tender-hearted, and forgiving. But we will only concentrate on the first aspect: kindness.

When was the last time someone said you were kind? Or has anyone ever said that? If not, why do you think no one has done that? Examine your heart – are you a kind child? We are often told as Christians to witness for Jesus, to be a good example for God. In fact, if we are kind children, a lot of friends may be drawn to Christ because of that. Kindness has converted more sinners than zeal or eloquence.

When should you be kind? Every day! Every day is a good day to be kind. The kindness we want to have is not only the outward appearance of niceties. It is not putting on an artificial smile or saying something nice but not meaning it. Real kindness comes from a heart cleansed by God. It is knowing how good God has been to us, and that in turn, we can learn to be like God in this aspect. It is another gift of the Holy Spirit!

But how do we show our kindness? These are a few ways:

1. When you don’t agree with someone, do not quarrel or argue.
Instead, talk about the problem calmly like friends!
This makes God happy.
2. If someone is being mean to you, do not be mean back.
Instead, show them God’s love by smiling and using kind words.
3. Share the things God has blessed you with others. Let your sister or brother play with your toys. Give your old clothes and toys away to someone else who needs them.
4. If you see someone who needs help, try to help them in the best way you can.

Thought: Kindness has converted more sinners than zeal or eloquence.

Prayer: Heavenly Father, at times I have been an unkind child. Please forgive me for I know that is wrong. May I learn kindness, kindness only the Holy Spirit can give, and in turn, that I may spread this kindness to the people around me. This I ask in Jesus’ name, Amen.

GIFT OF A TENDER HEART & FORGIVENESS

Seven-year old Seng Soon was excited to shoot hoops (play basketball) with his dad. “Ready dad?”. “Sure!”, said dad as they drove to the nearby basketball court. When they arrived, dad said, “Just one more minute, son. I have to make a phone call, you go on out there and practise and I’ll be right out.” “Okay” Seng Soon answered as he trotted to the basketball court. A few minutes passed and he had a great time shooting hoops, though none of them actually reached the basket. He pretended he was a famous basketball player and the outcome of the game depended on him. So he threw this next one with all his might! “He shoots, he... uhoh...”, the ball slammed through the window of dad’s car with a loud crash! Seng Soon ran to the scene. He saw the stunned face of dad, and started crying for fear of punishment from father.

What happened next? Do you think Seng Soon deserved punishment? How would you prefer this story to end?

Often, we are like Seng Soon. We have done something wrong, are really repentant about it, and confess to the Lord. And we know that our gracious God is always ready to forgive, if we confess our sins. As forgiven sinners, as someone who has experienced the wonder of a wrong forgiven, should we not also be of a tender heart and forgive others when they wrong us? The idea of a “tender heart” is to be compassionate, to be able to feel with and understand how someone who asks for forgiveness may be experiencing. It is really an extension of yesterday’s lesson – to be kind. If we are kind, we will be tender-hearted. If we are tender-hearted, if we do not bear grudges, we will also be a forgiving people.

Forgiveness is such an important aspect of a Christian’s life. If there were no forgiveness, there would be no Christian faith for without the forgiveness of God, Jesus would not have gone to the cross to bear our sins. Has anyone hurt you? Has anyone been unkind to you? Dear child, learn how to be tender-hearted and forgive that person. You will be able to do it with the strength of the Holy Spirit for a forgiving heart is a gift from the Holy Spirit.

Thought: Only the strong forgive; be strong in the Lord, and forgive!

Prayer: Heavenly Father, may you give me a tender heart and a heart of forgiveness. In Jesus’s name I pray, Amen.

IS THERE A GIFT OF GIVING?

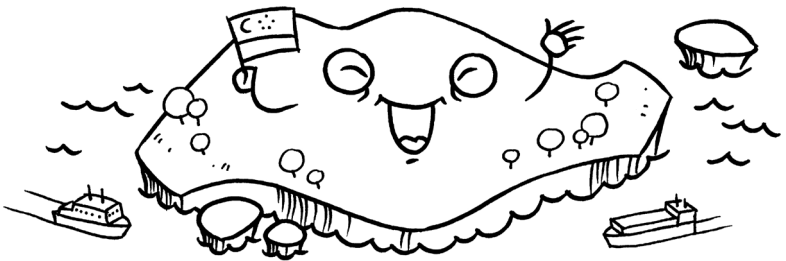
SINGAPORE'S NATIONAL DAY

Like many books of the Old Testament that tell of God's coming judgments for the sins of the people, the first 39 chapters of the book of Isaiah also tell of God's coming judgments, not only on Israel but also on the other wicked and ungodly, pagan nations that are Israel's neighbours. The last 27 chapters of the book tell of God's divine plan to restore His people, just as the New Testament contains the good news of God saving His people from their sins through His Son, Jesus Christ.

The book of Isaiah paints a wonderful picture of both God's justice and His mercy. Just as He judges Israel for their sins, He will also judge our sins. However, God will lovingly restore Israel, just as He will lovingly restore us if we believe and trust in His Son, Jesus Christ.

What was special about Isaiah was that he was a prophet, or God’s messenger. In the days of the Old Testament, God chose various men as His messengers to deliver His word to His people. Isaiah was chosen to reveal God’s judgement on His people. As a prophet, Isaiah must declare God’s word boldly, even if it is not what the people would want to hear. We, too, can learn from Isaiah’s example and be steadfast in our obedience and devotion to God.

2. The Assyrians under Sargon (Isaiah 22).
3. The Assyrians under Sennacherib (Isaiah 26).

Judah would have been totally destroyed if not for God's grace. Let us examine ourselves and ask whether we have been grateful to our parents and to God for all the good things we have received. May the Lord forgive us of the sin of ungratefulness.

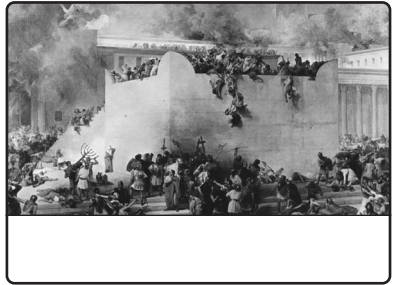
GOD KEEPS HIS PROMISES!

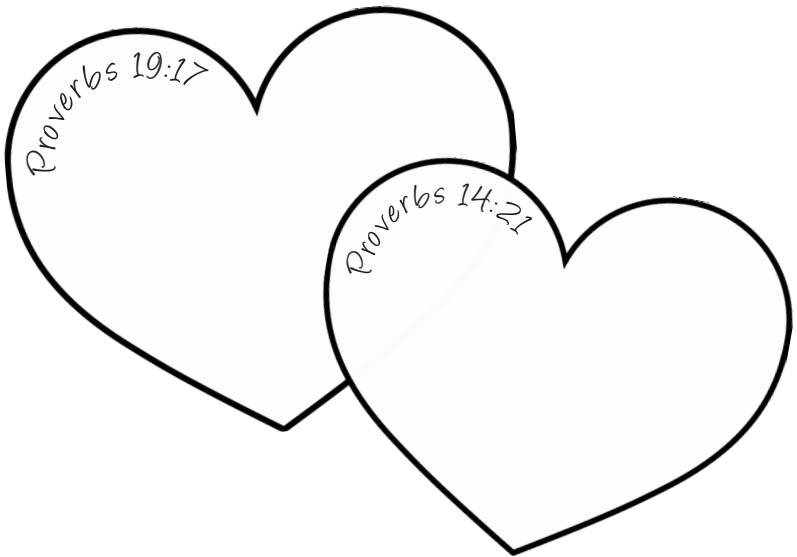

BIRTH OF JESUS FORETOLD!

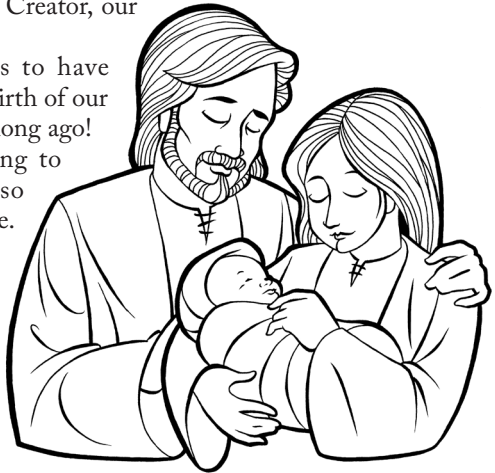

Prayer: Heavenly Father, thank You for Jesus, a wonderful Counsellor to me. May I go to Him and seek His grace so that I will know how to live a life that will please You. With His wisdom, even though I am but a child, I will know how to handle the challenges that may come my way. This I pray in Jesus' name, Amen.

PRINCE OF PEACE

On 11th Sep 2001 in New York City, something terrible happened. On that morning, 19 terrorists hijacked four commercial passenger jet airliners. The hijackers intentionally crashed two of the airliners into the Twin Towers of the World Trade Center in New York City, killing everyone on board and many others working in the buildings. Both buildings collapsed within two hours, destroying at least two nearby buildings and damaging others. The hijackers crashed a third airliner into the Pentagon – the military headquarters of the USA. The fourth plane crashed into a field, after some of its passengers and flight crew attempted to retake control of the plane, which the hijackers had redirected toward Washington – the capital of the USA. There were no survivors from any of the flights.

2,974 victims and the 19 hijackers died in the attacks. The overwhelming majority of casualties were civilians, including nationals of over 90 different countries. These attacks are now known as the “911 attacks”.

If a relative or friend of yours had died in the above attacks, would you still be able to call Jesus “Prince of Peace”?

It is possible, but it will not be easy. The peace that Jesus brings is not the peace that the world offers. The world’s peace is dependent on the lack of tough times or difficult situations. For a person without Christ, he will not be able to experience peace in the 911 attacks. But for us, we can depend on the love and strength of the Lord, even when things appear terrible. You see, if we trust God, if we put our lives into His hands, we will be able to have peace, come what may.

Thought: May Jesus be my Prince of Peace.

Prayer: Heavenly Father, thank You that in Jesus, I will have peace that the world cannot give. Sometimes, things do not work out the way I or my parents prefer. But Heavenly Father, do teach me to press on and continue to turn to You. This I pray in Jesus’ name, Amen.

GOD IS SOVEREIGN OVER ALL!

The God of Israel is also the God of all nations. God pronounces judgment on the nations around Israel, starting with Babylon. These announcements of doom are meant to console the hearts of the righteous in Judah so that they might set their hope in God, the ruler over the earth.

God would use the Medes, the “mighty ones for mine anger” (v.17) to conquer Babylon. At the time when Isaiah uttered this message of doom against Babylon, she was a vassal (nation weaker than and paying tributes to a stronger nation) of Assyria, being controlled by the kings of Nineveh. Later, Assyria became weak and was conquered by Babylon. Babylon lasted for 70 years. It was a mighty empire, a proud empire, but great was its fall when it was conquered. As in any war, there was great destruction, fear and trembling as the enemies entered their gates.

Our great God is sovereign over all nations. Let us rejoice that our loving Father is in control of all things which happen to us. No matter how powerful empires and their rulers are in their time, they fall. Past empires include those we have mentioned – where are they in the ranking of world powers? They are but a sad reflection of a glorious past.

Thought: The rise and fall of empires are in the hands of God.

Prayer: Heavenly Father, help us to remember all men are but dust, and that only You are the real sovereign over all. Thus, I want to be obedient and faithful to You. This I pray in Jesus' name, Amen.

FALL OF LUCIFER

The 4 verses of today's text tell us the world's most tragic and poignant story, of how a powerful angel called Lucifer fell into sin. Who is this angel Lucifer? He was created as one of the most beautiful and powerful angels. To him, God was gracious and kind. However, he betrayed his Creator and wanted to be like Him! Who is he? He is none other than Satan!

When Lucifer sinned and rebelled against his Master, God cast him down from heaven, along with a third of the angels who followed him. How do we know Lucifer sinned? A hint would be for you to count how many "I" in these four verses. Have you done that? How many did you find?

In the four verses, you find five phrases of "I will". Lucifer, due to pride of power and strength, challenged God and wanted to be like God. You see, Satan put himself before God and instead of worshipping God, wanted to be like God. In fact, he wanted to be better than God!

Pride is a most dangerous sin. Pride always starts with ourselves, with "I" or "Me" or "Mine". You know how to spell "sin" and "pride". What is in the middle of these 2 words? Again, the letter "I"!

Dear child, be careful of the letter "I". Many of us would already have fallen into the sin of putting ourselves before God and others. You must have seen how some children behave. They make demands of their parents, "I want to have that toy!" Some may tell friends, "I got such wonderful results!", or "Wow, I went to this exotic place for my June holidays!" The list goes on. Children who speak like that harbour pride. Dear child, may it not be said of you that you are like that.

Instead of pride, we must have humility. Even though you may be blessed with intelligence, musical talent, health and strength, never be prideful. Instead, be humble. How can you be humble? Just remember – all that you have is given by God.

Thought: May I be wary of the sin of pride!

Prayer: Thank You for being so merciful and gracious to me, Heavenly Father. I come before You humbly and ask that You forgive me for the pride that is in me. Please help me to remember all that I have is from Thy gracious hand. In Jesus' name I pray, Amen.

MAKING SENSE OF MIDDLE EAST TODAY...

Here, Isaiah is referring to the land of Philistines and warned them not to rejoice although “the rod of him that smote thee” which is the Assyrian king, is dead. A worse one would arise, “a cockatrice”. Philistia was doomed but Zion, by God’s appointment, shall stand.

You may not be aware but the Middle East today can be a volatile and dangerous area. Why is this so? Primarily because of the years of distrust and wars between Israel and her neighbours.

Today, when you read about Palestine, it refers to the lands around Israel which, during the First World War (1914 – 1918), under British rule, were populated by the Arabs. When the Jews returned to their homeland and became a nation in 1948, Palestine ceased to be used as a national name. It was changed to Israel. But the Arabs, now homeless because of the incoming Jews, clung to the name Palestine. They claim they are Palestinians, sons of the soil. Their mission is to liberate their country from the Jews. Hence, the unending war between the Israelis and the Palestinians.

Do you now understand the historical roots of the trouble in Israel?

Thought: God will end all wars on earth one day.

Prayer: Heavenly Father, no matter what world leaders do, they cannot achieve what only You can. I am so glad I have such a great Saviour and I pray I will always remain faithful. Please help me Lord. In Jesus’ name I pray, Amen.

ARE YOU DISCOURAGED?

Damascus is the capital of Syria. Syria had joined forces with the northern kingdom of Israel against Judah, the southern kingdom. This is a sad case of brother against brother. Isaiah predicted a message of doom for Syria and the northern kingdom – Israel – for all their schemings.

Both Syria and Israel would suffer the same fate and be conquered by the Assyrians. Like the harvestman or farmer reaping ears of corn and leaving only that which he cannot reach, so also will the inhabitants and wealth of Syria and Israel be swept away. Yet, God is merciful and there will be a remnant. This is described in the gathering of grapes and of olives. After the “shaking” and the “beating” of the trees, two or three berries would be left in the top branches. This tells us that God will preserve a remnant for His own glory.

As you look around you today, are you discouraged because there is so much sin and wrong in the world? Are you discouraged because true Christians are so few in number? Do not be dismayed, God always takes care of His own beloved children.

Look at the picture of the farmers shaking the olive trees.

Thought: Though no one go with me, still I will follow the Lord.

Prayer: Heavenly Father, let me always follow Thee and Thy people. Help me not to be afraid of being in the minority if that means it is to be right. Help me to dare to be different, for Your sake. In Jesus' name I pray, Amen.

GOD IS IN CHARGE!

Egypt and Assyria were the two superpowers in the ancient world. While the Assyrian power was growing stronger in Isaiah's days, Egyptian power was on the wane. This was working out according to God's plan for the nations. Egypt was an idolatrous land, and the time of its judgement was at hand.

God shall make use of the Assyrians to come into Egypt and conquer it. But before that, the country would be much weakened by internal strife—Egyptians fighting against other Egyptians. The economy of the country would also suffer, with waters of the River Nile drying up. In the ancient world, rivers were extremely important. We may not realise the importance of rivers but then, rivers could bring death or life. People used rivers for drinking, washing, irrigation, and transportation. And the powerful and long River Nile was the lifeline of Egypt; the country's fortunes rose and fell with the river.

You may recall how influential Egypt must have been in the time of Joseph and later, Moses. Under Joseph, Egypt was able to store up plenty to tide her through the lean years and when countries came a-begging, they must have given her a lot of precious stones and metals just to buy food. During the time of Moses, Egypt under Pharaoh was also powerful.

However, today's reading tells us that with God against Egypt, even the mighty Nile was useless and the wisdom of Egypt's wise men confounded. But not all is hopeless. God's arms remain wide open to all who will believe and today, many Egyptians would have accepted Christ as Lord and Savior and are believers themselves!

Thought: God is in charge over all!

Prayer: Heavenly Father, thank You for the reminder that You are in charge over all. As I see how troubles can affect my family, my friends and myself, I want to commit to You all these problems. They may be difficult for us to handle but surely You are able to help us as You are in complete control of all. May I always look to Jesus for help. In Jesus' name I pray, Amen.

END OF A WEALTHY AND SINFUL PEOPLE

In the days before air power, the ability to project power by way of ocean-going ships was something nations and cities were proud of. One such city was Tyre. However, to the sailors of Tyre returning from Tarshish (Spain), news reached them that made them sad and disappointed. They heard even when they were as far off as Chittim (Cyprus) that their precious and prosperous Tyre had fallen! She had become a wasteland. Because of her pride, Tyre could not escape judgement from the Lord; she would be taken captive to Babylon!

Like the Jews who were taken captive to Babylon for 70 years, so Tyre was doomed to the same fate (v.15). Isaiah prophesied that she would recover as “the Lord would visit Tyre” (v.17).

Tyre was a materialistic city which prospered by engaging in commerce for selfish ends, “fornication with all the kingdoms of the world”. God is not pleased with ill-gotten riches and a life of pleasure that does not give Him the glory. Many in the world rely on riches. Many in the world rely on connections and power. Let us not be such. May our parents not be such as well. If we are born into a wealthy family, we are to be humble for God has given our parents wealth. If we are born into a family of more modest means, we are to remain thankful to God for whatever we have, whether it be more or less, everything comes from our heavenly Father.

There is no wrong in being wealthy but it is wrong to want to be wealthy or to be boastful of wealth. Learn a lesson from the people of Tyre – never be proud of things or assets you may have, whether they be your gifts, or intelligence. Instead, trust in God and keep relying on Him.

Thought: The rise and fall of cities and nations are in God’s hands.

Prayer: Heavenly Father, may I depend on You and not on myself to solve problems that I may have. Help me to be prayerful and to also seek Your guidance. In Jesus’ name I pray, Amen.

THE COMING GLOBAL CALAMITY

From chapter 24 to 27, the prophet Isaiah describes a coming global calamity. God would lay waste to the earth as divine judgement (punishment from God) for the sin of the people of the earth. As the world was destroyed by the global flood during the days of Noah because of sin, the world will once again be destroyed, not by water but by fire, because man continues to sin and does not worship or obey God.

In the catastrophe to come, social standing will not make any difference, whether it is between priest and people, or servant and master, or maid and mistress. All will be equally affected. All will suffer pain, death, hunger and homelessness. All that is heard is crying and sorrow. However, there will be a small number, like the few grapes left behind in the harvesting, who will glorify the Lord in hard times like these. These will sing and cry aloud for Him. Truly a day is coming when the “LORD of hosts shall reign in mount Zion, and in Jerusalem” (verse 23) and that is the period we call the golden millennium.

If we lay up our treasures on earth, we will be brought to misery in the coming calamity. Let us heed the words of our Saviour when He said, “Lay not up for yourselves treasures upon earth, where moth and rust doth corrupt, and where thieves break through and steal. But lay up for yourselves treasures in heaven.” (Matthew 6:19-20a)

A global calamity that is coming will include all the cities of the world. In the map below write down some of these cities.

Thought: Jesus is a shelter in the time of storm.

Prayer: Heavenly Father, thank You for being my Rock and Fortress at all times. I pray that I will not fear when troubles arise, but lean completely on You, remembering You are my Rock and Fortress. In Jesus' name I pray, Amen.

GOD AWAITS OUR RETURN

There is a saying, “One with God is a majority”. We might be one against many but in God’s sight, we are the majority. God had told Israel before, “One man of you shall chase a thousand...” (Joshua 23:10). “And five of you shall chase a hundred, and a hundred of you shall put ten thousand to flight.” (Leviticus 26:8). What encouragement God was giving to His people!

But Judah refused to listen. Judah forsook the Lord and sought help from Egypt instead. Then this blessing was reversed. “One thousand shall flee at the rebuke of one; at the rebuke of five shall ye flee...” (Isaiah 30:17). When we refuse to listen to our God, he will work through circumstances in our lives, giving us hardship and difficulties, to bring us back to Himself.

Have you experienced this? Perhaps you have not been close to the Lord. Perhaps you have neglected reading his Word daily. Despite encouragement from your Sunday School teachers and friends, you continue to remain cold towards God. In times like these, He may send you difficulties and trouble to remind you of your weaknesses and to bring you back to Him. He waits patiently for us to return to Him. And when we do, He will not withhold His generous blessings. “And therefore will the LORD wait, that he may be gracious unto you” (verse 18) and “he will be very gracious unto thee at the voice of thy cry; when he shall hear it, he will answer thee” (verse 19).

Let us remain close to God. But if we ever stray, God is ever hopeful that we return to Him. Remember, dear child, God may have to allow tough times in your life to discipline you, as might a loving father disciplining a child he loves when he needs it.

Thought: May we always stay close to Him!

Prayer: Heavenly Father, give me grace to be obedient to all Your commands. Help me to remain faithful and if I ever stray, remind me Your arms are always wide open for me. In Jesus’ name I pray, Amen.

MAN'S EXTREMITY, GOD'S OPPORTUNITY

King Hezekiah was ruler over Judah but here we read of him in a sad and desperate state. Why? Under what circumstances would a ruler be so pessimistic?

The Assyrian king Sennacherib had raised a huge army to attack Judah. King Hezekiah's father, Ahaz, had faced a similar threat from the Syria-Israel alliance before. Instead of trusting God, he turned to Assyria for help, and disastrous results followed. Now, Hezekiah had to decide whether to trust man or God for deliverance.

Man's extremity is God's opportunity. Hezekiah made the right decision. He cast himself before the Lord. He had the spiritual understanding to seek God with all his heart and not to look to man. In earnest prayer, he spread the Assyrian king's letter of demand before the Lord. In deep contrition, he begged for mercy. That is a wise thing to do for God will listen to every penitent prayer. Dear child, if you are sincere in your prayers, the Lord will hear and answer! Soon came the piece of good news that God would defend the city for His own sake, and for David's sake (v.35). The destruction of 185,000 Assyrian troops in one night saved the day. God had worked a miracle!

Do you trust God in times of adversity? Rest in His assurance that "... all things work together for good to them that love God" (Romans 8:28).

Prayer: Great is Thy faithfulness, O Lord, unto me. I am so grateful for You have been such a kind God. Help me to keep close to You, in good times or bad. In Jesus' name I pray, Amen.

CAN GOD ADD YEARS TO ONE'S LIFE?

What is the average lifespan of a Singaporean? For a man, it is about 80 years, and for a woman, about 85 years. Many do a lot to try to lengthen their lives: pop vitamins, exercise, eat right, have a healthy work-life balance.

How old do you think King Hezekiah was when he was very ill? He was relatively young, at only 39 years old. That would be less than half of the average life expectancy of a Singaporean today! As king, he could do almost anything within his earthly power to improve his health and prolong his life. However, when he knew his life was near its end, he did not seek doctors or magicians; he prayed unto the Lord, crying his heart out to God. He believed God to be a merciful and kind Master.

Hezekiah wept as he prayed to the Lord. God was moved and granted him 15 more years. God also graciously added another blessing – that He will defend Judah from the king of Assyria.

To confirm His promise, God moved the shadow of the sundial of Ahaz (Hezekiah's father) ten degrees backward (vs 8), as a sign that He had extended Hezekiah's days.

Imagine your father is about the age of Hezekiah, and has suddenly been diagnosed with an incurable disease. The doctors are not hopeful; 3 months is all they give him to live. What do you do? What fears will occupy your mind? What will happen to the family without your father?

Dear child, do you believe in the power of prayer? God's word tells us that "[the] effectual fervent prayer of a righteous man availeth much" (James 5:16). Dear child, go humbly to the Giver of life that we may find help in time of need.

Thought: Do you believe in the power of prayer?

Prayer: Heavenly Father, I confess that at times, I lack faith. Grant me the faith to believe, to be able to know that in Your hands lie my future, and that of my family. Therefore, I pray my family and I will continue to keep close to You. This I pray in Jesus' name, Amen.

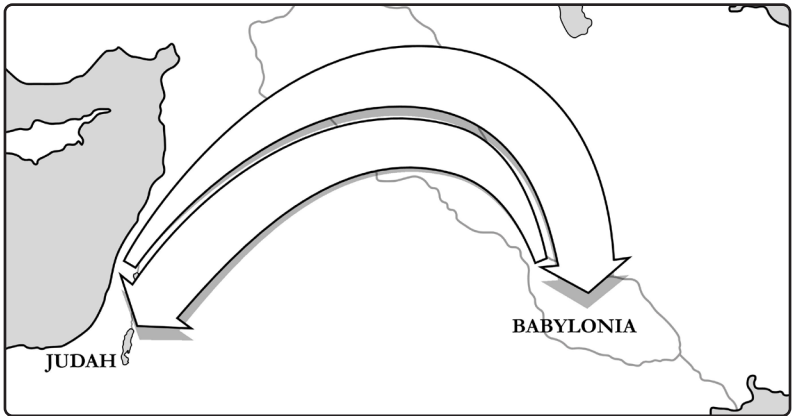
FROM CAPTIVITY TO RESTORATION

While chapters 1-39 of Isaiah tell of God's judgments for the sins of the people of Judah and the surrounding nations, chapters 40-66 tell of God's consolation and the restoration of Judah. Chapter 39 closes with Judah's coming conquest and captivity by Babylon. Chapter 40 opens with comforting words of their restoration and return back to their homeland.

God had covenanted with His people that He would love them with an everlasting love. He will chastise His people when they sin but He will also forgive them when they repent. God is faithful to His promises to give His people a glorious future, even as He deals with them for their sin and rebellion.

Do you trust in God's faithfulness? He is like a Good Shepherd who "shall gather the lambs with his arm, and carry them in his bosom" (verse 11). He will never fail to carry out His promises.

If you believe the world is flat today, people will laugh at you. They may ask what school you attend for if such a school teaches such a wrong notion, these people will not send their children there. However, do you know that for a few thousand years, most people believed the earth was flat?

Had these people read the 2 verses you read, and believed them, they would know the earth is not flat but round! You see, there were many people in the past, and still many today, who believe the bible is an outdated book written by a group of men who came together to try to mislead weak-minded people into believing a person called Jesus. Nothing can be further from the truth. Though man has tried countless times to destroy and discredit the Bible, the Precious Word of God has stood firm and undaunted.

Dear child, there is much gain from reading and believing in the bible. Unfortunately, it is not popular to read the bible or go to Sunday school. Your friends may laugh at you, jesting that there is enough to read from school work. "Forget about the bible!", they may tell you. And they laugh at you for going to Sunday School or Junior Worship. "Isn't going to school five days a week already enough?", some of them may scoff at you.

What do you do in times like these? Three things. Firstly, do not be angry with these friends or schoolmates. These people do not need our anger, they need our compassion and understanding. Secondly, we need to pray for them that God will be merciful to open their spiritual eyes to see spiritual truth. Thirdly, we pray for ourselves that God will grant us the courage to continue to treasure His Word, that we may press on in our Christian walk.

Thought: The Holy Word is never wrong, but the world often is!

Prayer: Heavenly Father, thank You for giving me Your precious Word. May I continue to treasure it by reading and obeying it daily. You know it is sometimes not easy to do so and therefore Heavenly Father, do grant me strength. In Jesus' name I pray, Amen.

OUR GOD IS THE GREATEST!

Our God is great and His greatness is beyond compare, and there is no searching of His understanding. The Lord promises to answer His people's prayers. He would provide for all their needs. When they are thirsty, He would provide them water, in the hilltops, in the valleys, and even in the desert. He would provide shade in the wilderness.

In contrast with the power of the living and true God, the gods of the nations are powerless. Most idols are carved from wood or forged from metal. "Behold, they are all vanity; their works are nothing; their molten images are wind and confusion" (v.29). There are shops in housing estates which sell such idols and it is somewhat bizarre to see shop-owners handling and cleaning such idols, selling them, and then claiming these same merchandise they put up for sale can protect them!

Let us not place our faith in idols. We have a powerful God who is ready to answer our prayers. I guess very few children like you would have physical idols but many of us have non-physical idols. What can these be? Perhaps you idolise someone and this could be your parent, or school teacher, friend, or even some TV character. Do not do that, for it is a sin. Or perhaps you idolise a strength you have, a talent you are blessed with. Dear child, please be very careful.

There is a beautiful chorus that spells out the greatness and goodness of our heavenly Father. Do you know this song? Ask your parent or elder sibling if they could teach you...

Our God is far greater than words can make known

Exalted and holy, He sits on His throne

In infinite splendor He rules over all,

Yet He feeds the poor sparrow, and knows when they fall

Thought: The greatest God is my most tender Father.

Prayer: Heavenly Father, thank You that even though You are the powerful Lord of all, You are at the same time my gracious Abba Father. I place my trust in You, and ask that You kindly continue to watch over me. In Jesus' name I pray, Amen.

CHRIST THE SUFFERING SERVANT

The heart of the book of Isaiah is this famous chapter. It tells of the humiliation and suffering the Lord Jesus Christ would go through while on earth. Jesus left heaven's glory to take upon himself the form of a humble servant.

He was born "a root out of dry ground" for though he was of the royal lineage of King David, His heritage was not held in regard by the people. He was the son of a carpenter, not a king. He was born in a stable, not a palace. The stable is not a nice cuddly place that some of us may think it to be from Christmas cards depicting Christmas. On the other hand, the stable is a smelly and dirty place that few of you would rather be. In such a setting, the great God and King, our precious Lord, chose to be born.

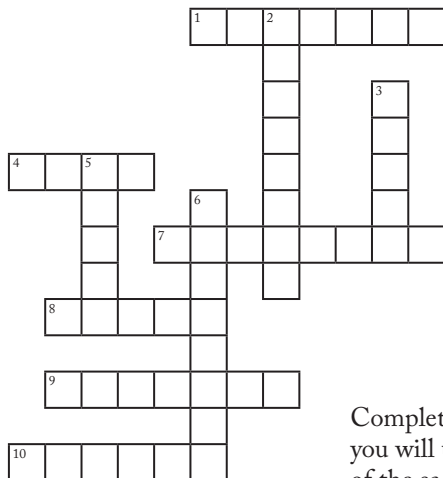
Jesus also did not come as a striking or handsome man with an attractive physical appearance that would draw people to Him. He was not what the Jews had expected of the coming Messiah. They were expecting their Messiah to come in pomp and power. Instead, the life of Jesus was like a tender plant, silent and unnoticed. He told his disciples that He had nowhere to lay His head as He went from town to town preaching the gospel. One of the most important places in everyone's life is his home. The home is also the favourite destination of travellers, especially those who go on frequent business trips. Some of you may have parents who travel a lot for business. If you ask them, they will tell you how much they long to come home to see you during those long trips!

Jesus was also acquainted with the sorrows of the people, their sicknesses and their deaths. We have never read that He jested or enjoyed life, but at times He wept. He came to save mankind but they rejected Him for they only saw His humiliation and sufferings. Of course, the greatest act of humility and love of our precious Saviour is his final and ultimate act of love, when he sacrificed himself on the cross. Dear child, this is the wonderful Saviour we have. For all the power He had, he came as a suffering servant for you and me

Thought: O what a great Saviour I have in Jesus!

Prayer: Heavenly Father, I am awed by such a wonderful Saviour and Friend I have in Jesus. These few verses really remind me of how much He suffered and I want to say I love You Heavenly Father. May I be faithful, as I see how much You have suffered for me. This I pray in the dear name of Jesus, Amen.

If humiliation is the key word for chapter 53, jubilation aptly characterises chapter 54. As a result of the suffering of the Servant Messiah, exuberant life breaks forth for His people. We really do owe it all to Jesus. Think about it - because Jesus suffered and was humiliated, we could be saved and receive victory and jubilation (rejoicing and delight). However, for people who do not accept our suffering Saviour, they will not be able to have jubilation.

When there is real repentance, God is more than prepared to forgive and restore. That is why in today's passage, God expresses His love to Israel as a loving Husband would to a restored wife. Then, Israel will be blessed and become fruitful again.

In a way, the church today is like the Israel of old. If the church is cleansed and is repentant, she will be restored to God. Then only would the church be pure and growing again. Then only would she be jubilant and victorious again!

The same applies to you, dear child. If you want victory and jubilation in your life, you must receive the suffering Christ. By accepting the suffering Christ, it also means you must be prepared to suffer for Christ. It is not likely you will be called to be physically tortured for Christ, to be pushed and shoved around for the sake of Christ.

Perhaps what you may need to suffer for Jesus would be to "sacrifice" some sleep for Him as you press on in doing your devotion. Or perhaps standing up for Jesus in daring to be different from other children in school. Or maybe taking the extra effort to be kind to someone new, or even becoming unpopular, or bullied for your faith in Christ. If you commit to the Lord and dare to do these for Christ, He will fill you with joy and jubilation in knowing you did what you did in the strength of the Lord.

Thought: We shall eventually have jubilation.

Prayer: Heavenly Father, thank You for today's lesson. Help me to dare to suffer for You, so that I will be able to participate in the jubilation to come. In Jesus' name I pray, Amen.

FROM ONE TO ALL

Here, the prophet looks beyond Israel to the whole world, from one to all. This is the Gospel invitation to everyone who despairs of the futility of life without God, who begins to thirst and yearn after Him.

The Gospel is the good news of the Saviour Jesus Christ. He is the living water that gives everlasting life (John 4:14). From Him comes “the sincere milk of the word that ye may grow thereby” (1 Peter 2:2). He is the Bread of life, “which cometh down from heaven, that a man may eat thereof, and not die” (John 6:50). The Lord Jesus offered Himself as a sacrifice for us freely and our salvation is priceless; it cannot be bought with money.

Spiritually, to hearken diligently and eat that which is good is surely to hear the Word of God with our ears. When the Word of God is taught to you, do you listen carefully and thank God for His love and His goodness? That is to “eat that which is good”.

We are also to observe the Sabbath Day (Lord's Day in the New Testament) as a test of our love, devotion and trust in the Lord. The blessing of keeping the Lord's Day holy is strength and direction from God throughout the coming week.

All who genuinely seek after God place their faith in Him. Even "strangers" and "eunuchs", will be accepted by Him. The Lord will bless them and give them "a place and a name better than of sons and daughters" if they come to Him. When they join themselves to the Lord, to serve Him, and to love Him, God will love them, too. What a wonderful God we have! Not only is He kind, fair and just, but he is also full of loving kindness to take in and care for the rejected and outcasts of the earth.

AFTER DISCIPLINE, RESTORATION

Have you ever seen cases of awful conduct from children? Perhaps they were rude, or inconsiderate, or unkind, or proud; the list goes on. One of the cases I have seen occurred in a supermarket. A lady was trying to push the trolley and get some marketing done, but her child was insistent on having something he wanted. When she refused, he started throwing a tantrum and crying loudly to embarrass her.

We know all of us have been naughty. When was the last time you were disciplined? Do you like being disciplined? Well, does anyone ever like being disciplined? I guess not. But we know discipline is good and necessary. Discipline can come in different ways; our parents may actually have to spank us for serious offences, or scold us, or restrict our liberties, or have us stand in some “naughty corner”. However, if and when we truly repent, our parents will lovingly embrace us again. Why do they do that? Simple - because they are our parents! Remember that parents do not like to punish their children, but it is a responsibility that they must fulfil.

God is like that, too. When we go astray or when we sin against Him, He will have to punish or discipline us for our own sake. God does not delight in disciplining us but when He sees us falling into sin such as mixing with bad company and not allowing the Holy Spirit to control our lives, He will intervene and bring us back to Him.

Don't assume that because you were raised in church, you are immune from all the temptations faced by other kids. There are many kids from families of long-time Christians who have rejected their parent's teaching and have made some terrible choices in life.

Always remember, discipline is good for you and after discipline, God will want to restore you to Himself, so that your walk with Him will be right again.

Thought: If ever disciplined, may I be grateful and return to the Father.

Prayer: Heavenly Father, do keep me close to Thee. Should I fall along the way and be chastised or disciplined, help me to accept it as from a loving Father in heaven and to try to walk close to Thee again. This I pray in Jesus' name, Amen.

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
