“Darren, I want you to complete these before school opens. Your PSLE is coming. You need to work doubly hard,” said his mother, while thrusting a stack of assessment books onto his study desk.

Darren let out a loud groan and said, “Mom, you are torturing me. I am going to explode with this extra work. Look at the piles of homework the teachers have already given me!”

“Alright. Alright. I know you are under a lot of pressure. You must still work hard. No point arguing. Tell you what. If you work hard and do well, I promise to take you to Disney World in Florida.”

“Do you really mean it? Thanks Mom! I will work really, really hard.”

Darren’s mother has just made him a promise. Darren trusts his mother. So far, she has kept all her promises. He is encouraged to work hard.

A promise is normally an agreement to give or do or be something.

In Darren’s case, his mother has agreed to give him a vacation overseas if he does well. It is to encourage him to work hard. The Bible says God has made “covenants” or agreements with His people to encourage them to walk in His ways.

This month, we will study the Bible to find out what promises God has made. Knowing His promises will help us know more about God. The first promise God made to mankind is the promise of ETERNAL LIFE through faith in Jesus.

Have you received eternal life? Do you believe that Jesus Christ died for your sins, was buried and rose again the third day and is now in Heaven with our Heavenly Father? If you believe that Jesus is your Saviour, you are a child of God and no more a slave to sin. You will receive all the precious and great promises of God that our Heavenly Father gives to whoever believes.

Let’s do a simple equation:

Faith in Jesus = E _____ L _____

Thought: God’s first promise is eternal life to those who believe.

Prayer: Heavenly Father, I believe all Your promises are true. Thank You for Your promise of eternal life. In Jesus’ name I pray, Amen.


BELIEVING IS RECEIVING

Darren believes that his mother will keep her promise. That is why he resolves to work very hard. Suppose he doubts his mother's word. Will he still have the motivation to work hard? To him, his mother has so far never gone back on her word. He has faith in his mother.

The Bible says that God promised Abraham that his descendants would be as many as the stars in the sky and the sand on the beach. Abraham believed God who truly made him the father of many nations. Although both Abraham and Sarah were too old to bear children they continued to believe that God would do as promised. In man's thinking, it was against all odds that a 100-year-old man and a barren ninety-year-old woman could bear a son. But whatever doubts man may have had, Isaac was born! Abraham had faith in God's promise. Abraham is known as the Father of Faith and all of us who believe in God are children of faith.

As children of God, we should never doubt God's Word. If we do, we are effectively saying that God is a liar and His promises are not worth believing in. But God is truth, and everyone who disbelieves Him is a fool. Once God has spoken, whatever He has said will come to pass. We cannot receive God's promises if we do not believe in Him.

Charles Spurgeon, a great preacher of the 19th century, compared a promise of God to a cheque. It is a promissory note to be exchanged for hard cash through a bank. If we do not believe in the value of the cheque and do nothing about it, we cannot enjoy the use of the money given to us. The experience will be the same with the promises of God.



What did Abraham do with the 'cheque' God gave to him. Believing that God will honour it, Abraham lived a blessed life of trust and obedience. He has faith in God, our Heavenly Father. He believed and therefore received.

Thought: Faith means believing that God will do what He says.

Prayer: Heavenly Father, help me to believe in Your Word so that I will receive all the blessings that You have promised. In Jesus' name I pray, Amen.

GOD'S PROMISES ARE MADE FOR HIS CHILDREN

Who are God's children? Only those of us who have believed and accepted Jesus as our Saviour, can be called the children of God. No unbeliever can be called a child of God. As His children, we have the privilege to call God "Heavenly Father" or "Abba", which is a special and close way of addressing one's father. Our relationship with God comes about "through the righteousness of faith".

Yesterday, we learnt that without faith, we cannot enjoy the benefits of God's promises. Today, we learn that those without faith are not children of God and therefore cannot appropriate His promises. The children of God are justified by faith. It means that we are considered righteous in God's eyes because of our faith in Jesus. God's promises are meant for the children of faith only.

When a man writes a will, who do you think will be the first to be named as heirs to his money and assets? Naturally, it will be his closest next-of-kin. That will be his children and his relations. He will not name a stranger. It has to be someone he loves. Do you know what? The Bible says that as children of God, we are heirs of God and joint-heirs with Christ. Is that not wonderful? God will give us a share of the inheritance in the Kingdom of Heaven. God's many precious and great promises are especially reserved for us, for we are His children by faith.

GOD'S PROMISES ARE ALWAYS TRUE

Let us name a few of the promises in the Old Testament:

To Abraham

Father of many nations and descendants as countless as the stars in the sky and sand on the beach.

Fulfilled:

His wife, Sarah conceived and gave birth to Isaac at the age of ninety. Jacob, his son gave rise to twelve tribes. All children of faith are also included as his descendants.

To Abraham, Moses and Joshua

The Promised Land flowing with milk and honey.

Fulfilled:

Moses led God's people out of Egypt the land of bondage. Joshua succeeded in conquering Canaan.

To King David

The kingly line of David will be forever.

Fulfilled:

Jesus who will be the King of kings came from the lineage of King David. He will rule forever.

To mankind

A son of woman will bruise Satan's head.
A saviour will come to save sinners.

Fulfilled:

Jesus came and conquered death by rising the third day after his death on the cross.

Jesus says He will come again and has promised to prepare a mansion in Heaven for every Christian (John 14:2). That means He will prepare a mansion for you and for me. Have you been to a mansion? It is a wonderful and large home, and that is what awaits us in Heaven!

Thought: God is faithful and keeps every single one of His promises.

Prayer: Heavenly Father, thank You for Your faithfulness. Help me to obey Thy commandments and keep me from evil. They are for my own good. In Jesus' name I pray, Amen.

PRECIOUS PROMISES


Need a drink of water? Just turn on the tap! It is so easily available in Singapore, isn't it? That is why we don't really bother about how much water costs. Let us look at another scenario. Imagine a man, perspiring and thirsty, staggering in the hot and dry desert. How much do you think he would give in exchange for just a sip of water? To this suffering man who is in great need of water to survive, water is precious as he needs it desperately. Similarly, as sinners we are in great need of the Saviour whom God has promised. EXCEEDINGLY GREAT PROMISES



To some of us, a trip to Sentosa is great enough and that is the right way to view rewards from parents.

Now, the Bible says that God's promises are not just great but exceedingly great! He is taking us to a place much better than any wonderful destination on earth! He is taking us to Heaven! Can you think of a greater promise than this? Why are God's promises exceedingly great?

Our God is great! He is omnipotent. That means He has power over everything. Nothing is impossible for God to do. God is omniscient. That means He knows everything from beginning to end. God knows even your thoughts, be they past, present or future. God is omnipresent or everywhere all the time. God is supreme in glory and His promises are great in power and wisdom.

Do you know what the word 'exceeding' means? It means far more than what we can expect. Did you expect your sins to be washed away as though you have never sinned? There will be no trace of them in God's record once you have confessed them. Jesus' precious blood will wash you white as snow. God has also promised to love you with an everlasting love and protect you day and night. Is there anybody greater than God? Exceedingly great are God's promises.

“I AM WITH YOU ALWAYS”

Imagine that Darren had done very well in his PSLE, but due to unforeseen circumstances his mother was unable to honour her promise, while his father was also tied up with his job and not able to take leave to accompany him. His mother then bought Darren an air ticket, booked a guided tour with a hotel stay of 7 days in Florida, and sent him off at the airport. Do you think Darren would enjoy the trip without his parents? Of course not!

God will never leave His children to fight their battles alone. He promised Moses, “My presence shall go with thee...” and it did happen. Moses experienced God’s presence throughout his 40-year-long journey to the Promised Land. God assured His people of His presence in many ways. There was a pillar of cloud by day and a pillar of fire at night to lead the way. Supplies of manna and all daily needs were met! It was an overwhelming task to lead two million murmuring people through the wilderness, but God was always with him giving wisdom and counsel on how to handle all the problems. Joshua succeeded Moses. He was also given the promise of God’s presence. Wherever Joshua went, God would be there with him.

Before Jesus ascended to Heaven, He promised to send the Holy Spirit to comfort the Christians. Jesus was called Emmanuel, “God with us”, and in His own words had said, “I am with you always, even unto the end of the world.”

Do you believe that God is always with you?

Do not be. God has promised that He would be with you, and take care of you. He will keep His promises!

“I WILL NEVER LEAVE OR FORSAKE YOU”

You have parents who love and take care of you. This is a privilege not all children enjoy. There are children who are abandoned by their parents at birth. There are centres set up by some kind-hearted people to take care of these children until some childless couples come to adopt them. That is a happy ending for these kids, is it not?

Unlike the abandoned children, we are not given up for adoption by our earthly parents, but we can be adopted too – not by other earthly parents, but by God. As Christians, we are children of faith, and we receive God’s precious promises. We recently learned that He promises to be with us always. Today, the Bible confirms that He will never leave us or forsake us.

Today’s verse teaches us not to covet – that is not to desire things that do not belong to us. In other words – do not be greedy. We are already well-fed, well dressed and well equipped with study materials and toys. Yet, we sometimes wish we have our friends’ newer mobile phones and computer games, fashionable outfits, or even their parents who can afford posh homes and cars.

The Bible tells us not to be covetous, pining for things that are not meant for us. God will take care of our every need. Therefore, we have no fear that we will go hungry or be short of anything. Given God’s wonderful promise, we ought to be truly content.

Let us recall the promise Darren's mother made. If Darren works hard and does well in his PSLE, she will take him to Disney World. There is a conditional "IF" in this agreement between her and Darren. Unless Darren does his part, he will not receive the reward offered to him. We too have to do our part by believing in Jesus, in putting our faith in Him, before we can become children of God. As His children, we will receive all His promises.

In Old Testament times, there were no hotels or houses in the wilderness. Travelers dwelled in tents in open and unprotected places where enemies, thieves and wild animals could easily intrude, especially in the night, so someone must stay awake to guard the tents. Psalm 34:7 says, "The angel of the LORD encampeth round about them that fear him, and delivereth them." Notice that God promised protection and safety to only those who fear Him. What does it mean to "fear God"? It is to be afraid of making Him displeased, and that means we are to obey God. He promised to protect only those who love and obey Him. So, unless we do our part, we have no part in His promises.

Do you have faith in Him? Do you really commit your worries or problems to Him? How is your prayer life? Do you set aside a time everyday to pray to Him, to do your QT?

GOD WILL PROTECT AND KEEP YOU SAFE

Whenever someone travels overseas, the adults in church will pray for safety and God's journey mercies for the traveller. Even at home we pray for safety, especially for our children. It is because we are surrounded by danger all the time. We hear news of plane crashes, road accidents, tsunamis and fires that do kill up to hundreds. Some are natural disasters and some are caused by equipment faults or human error. Whatever they may be, Christians are assured that God is in control. That is why we pray for protection.

God has given us His promise of constant protection and preservation wherever we are. The traveller (as described in Psalm 121) looked to the hills for help and comfort. His journey was treacherous, and the hot sun and the cold nights, and wild animals, all posed threats to his life. He could stumble anytime and die. His body could even be a feast for vultures! So, he wisely looked to God. No one but God is able to watch over him all the time. God "will not suffer thy foot to be moved." God would never doze off or sleep for a moment. He is constantly watching over us.

Does God care only to protect us from bodily harm? The psalmist says, "The Lord shall preserve thee from all evil". God cares for our souls even more. He has promised to keep us from evil. When pride, envy, greed and hate attack us, God's

Word will defend us. His Word is sharper than a two-edged sword and is our best defence weapon. Do not forget to pray for God's protection.

GOD WILL FORGIVE WHEN YOU CONFESS

Have you ever told a lie? Be careful with your answer. If you answer “Never”, you have just told another lie! Lying is a sin. Do you feel guilty after telling a lie? If you do not, then there is reason to worry. Your conscience is seared. Even the Holy Spirit cannot make you see that you have done wrong and have sinned against God. He may not be in you.

What is the right thing to do if you realise that you have told a lie? Tell the person or persons you have lied to that you are sorry. A Christian who has lied will feel disturbed until he repents. For example, you denied copying your classmate’s answers when in reality you did. Or you had broken your neighbour’s window and put the blame on your friend. This may result in your friend or classmate not forgiving or trusting you ever again. This is the consequence of sin. Sin always results in suffering and pain.

More importantly, you need to confess your sin to the Lord who has given us a wonderful promise. Unlike your non-Christian friend or classmate who may or may not forgive you, God will forgive you and forget your sins.

OUR RESURRECTION TO GLORY


Christians believe in a living Saviour. If Jesus had not risen from death, our faith would be a fake one. God's promises would not be true and we would be the most miserable people on earth! Let us study the Bible to see what happened to Jesus after He was crucified. This must be important to us for the Bible says that we will also experience the bodily resurrection like our Lord Jesus.

When Jesus was on the cross, the Roman soldiers wanted to break his legs to speed up his death. However, they found that Jesus had already died (John 19: 33). Then His followers, Nicodemus and Joseph came to receive Jesus' body for burial. His body was bound in strips of linen with spices according to the Jewish custom and laid in the tomb of Gethsemane. (John 19: 40-41).

On the third day of Jesus' burial, Mary Magdalene and some ladies came to visit the tomb. To their surprise, they found the stone rolled away! When Peter was told about the empty tomb, he ran into the cave and found only the burial linen but no body. Later, Jesus appeared to Mary and his disciples before He ascended into Heaven. (John 20:14 - John 21:14). Our Saviour is living today and is seated at the right hand of our Heavenly Father.

God has promised His children that their bodies buried at death will rise from the grave to meet our Lord Jesus in the air on the day of rapture (1 Thessalonians 4:15). Those will be their glorified bodies and what a sight it will be !



ANSWERED PRAYERS

Jeremiah 33:3, is sometimes known as God's "telephone number". Of course, it is not a literal one, but it is a wonderful reminder that God is available to us day and night. In modern day language, some call it 24/7. However, our sin will interrupt this communication line. Sometimes, when we disobey our parents, pick fights with our brother or cheat in a test, God will suspend our line. To restore the line, we need to first repent and ask God for forgiveness.

The Bible says we ought to pray always. This means we can freely tell God our feelings and problems and seek His help anytime and anywhere. In today's verse, we see God telling Jeremiah to call upon Him because He wants to show him "great and mighty things". God wants us to know Him and His desires. Just as fathers love their children and want to 'bond' with them, God delights in our fellowship with Him. Unless we read God's Word and pray, how else can we have heart-to-heart talks with our Lord?

God has the power to do all things. He can give us courage to do things according to His will and to trust in Him. When you need courage to tell your principal that you cannot take part in the inter-school badminton competition because of the family church camp, what will you do? When you are prompted by the Holy Spirit to speak to your staunch idol-worshipping grandma, do you pray believing that God can change her heart? Remember Jesus' promise: "Ask and ye shall receive".

DON'T BE LIKE A DOOR!

Are you a hardworking child or the slothful, as described in today's verse, who likes to laze in bed?

Look at any door in your house, and you'd understand the wisdom of this verse. The door is opened and closed so often, but it remains fixed to the wall because of its hinges. Likewise, the lazy child who turns and tosses in bed will remain in bed without getting out to do something useful because his back is always on the bed!

In what ways can you be hardworking? Let's focus on three areas:

1. Clearly as a student, you have to study hard. Try your best in your work and honour God in that way. Do not wait till examinations are round the corner before you put in effort to study. The secret is to be consistent in your schoolwork.
2. Work hard at being a good student of God's Word. Be faithful in reading the Bible and doing your daily QT. When reading His Word, do so with a humble heart, asking God to teach you as you read.
3. Help out at home. Some of you may have the privilege of a maid at home, but it would be a wonderful Christian testimony if you make an effort to help lighten the maid's workload.

It is finished!" These 3 words which Jesus uttered just before He died on the cross marked the end of His work on earth. He had worked hard right until the last moment. At the age of twelve, He was already diligently doing God's work. He said to Mary, His mother, as He was teaching in the synagogue: "Wist ye not that I must be about my Father's business?" He was busy with God's work. In fact, He is the supreme example of a diligent man, wasting no time at all. Jesus put up with all the jeers and pain. Without a murmur, He fulfilled God's salvation plan for man.

GOD WILL GIVE YOU COURAGE

God appointed Joshua to lead two million people into a new land called Canaan. However, that land was occupied with people who hated God and the Israelites. In order to bring his people in, Joshua had to wage war against the inhabitants.

Oh no! Joshua looked at the people of Israel who were so weak and untrained in warfare. How could they stand against the Canaanites, who were such seasoned warriors? It was such an uphill task. How could Joshua not be afraid?

God understood Joshua's fears. Let us see how God gave Joshua confidence and courage to carry out the war campaigns. First, He encouraged Joshua in words, "Be strong and of a good courage." God promised to go with Joshua wherever he would go and would never leave or forsake him. He promised Joshua victory. Joshua faithfully obeyed God and was strengthened.

Secondly, God encouraged Joshua by the miracles He had done. He showed Joshua that He has power to do the impossible. You may remember the account of the waters of Jordan standing still as walls to let the people cross as well as the walls of Jericho tumbling down at the sound of the people's shouting. These were impossible by man's thinking but by God's might, nothing is impossible. As long as the people exercised faith by acting in accordance to God's commands, victory was won. Are we not afraid sometimes when homework, exams or school duties seem so difficult? Recall all the great things God has done for you and pray for courage.

GOD WILL SUPPLY OUR EVERY NEED

“Can you buy me that badminton racket? I really want to use the best brand for my competition.” You might have heard someone saying this to his father, or your sister saying to your mum, “Mummy! Can I order that outfit online? It is this year’s trend. I want to wear it to my friend’s birthday party.” What is the common term found in both these requests ? It is the word “want”. Do they really need the things they asked for?

Food, water and shelter are our basic physical needs. Of course, our needs do change with time. For example, some adults nowadays may not be able to keep a job without a car , a computer or a mobile phone. These items that were once considered luxury items have become necessary items for some people. Nevertheless, whatever our needs are, God has promised to supply them.

Most children in Singapore are very blessed as they have never experienced poverty and hunger. Perhaps you were last hungry when mum was late in preparing a meal, or your family was not able to get to the fast-food restaurant on time. Are you aware of the millions of children in poor countries who face real hunger everyday?

Guess the number of people in the world who are hungry as you are reading this. The kind of hunger they are experiencing is not what you have experienced. Theirs is due to a serious lack of food and nutrition. What is your guess? The estimate is about 850,000,000 people. That is a lot of people! While we thank God we are not in this group of people, we want to remember that all the wonderful things we have are from God. Remember, God has promised to fulfill all your NEEDS, but NOT all your wants.

God knows we have spiritual needs as well and will supply them. He has promised us gifts of faith, peace, joy, love, mercy and grace. Look at how He has given us Jesus Christ as our Saviour, and the Bible that contains all His precious promises, and the Holy Spirit of truth.

Sometimes, a father may lose his job, but God will never leave the family hungry. He will provide somehow. Whenever we are tempted to doubt, God will provide a way for us to escape. How much will God provide? According to His riches in glory. The infinitely wealthy God will provide!

Thought: God will provide.

Prayer: Heavenly Father, glory be to Your name. You never fail to supply all my needs. I thank You for what I already have, and continue to trust You for all my future needs. In Jesus’ name I pray, Amen.

GOD'S PROMISE OF GRACE

The Apostle Paul was plagued by an undisclosed disease or weakness. It was described as “a thorn in his flesh”. Causing him tremendous distress and pain, he prayed three times for God to remove it. However, God’s answer was “No”. Why? Because God wanted Paul to experience weakness so that he can continue to rely on God. That is why God gave these beautiful words in today’s text for Paul’s encouragement, “My grace is sufficient for thee: for my strength is made perfect in weakness.”

What is God’s grace? It is the unmerited favour from God. It means what we do not deserve, yet God gives it to us. God loves us and by His wisdom will always give us what is best for us. What? You mean the illness or weakness was best for Paul? Yes, in God’s eyes it was, and it ought to be for Paul and us. Why? This is to teach us to rely on God always as it is so easy to forget and forsake God if we never have any weakness or problem.

Why did God not heal Paul of his weakness? Paul was so actively serving God preaching, teaching and establishing churches. Would it not be better for Paul to be in a perfect condition to carry on with his work? In man’s eyes, Paul was doing a great job! Well, the Bible says all glory belongs to God. He loves Paul and does not want Paul to be puffed up with pride. Pride will lead to a fall.

God wants Paul to continue to depend fully on Christ and not on his own strength. God’s grace is sufficient to strengthen Paul to do whatever he was commanded to do. Others may then look at Paul’s life and praise God for His grace.

I need God’s grace so that:

ALL THINGS WORK TOGETHER FOR GOOD

To those who love God, all things will work out good. In other words, a Christian's life will turn out for good eventually, even though bad things happen. To understand more, let us look at the life of one famous Biblical character named Joseph.

Out of jealousy, Joseph's brothers threw him into a pit and then sold him to some merchants. He was brought thousands of miles from home to Egypt and sold to Potiphar as a slave. Joseph fled from Potiphar's adulterous wife but was falsely accused of molest. That landed him in prison. If you were Joseph, would you have continued to trust God?

Although Joseph has lost family bliss, a familiar lifestyle, and his freedom, he did not stop believing in God or His justice. As God had, in a dream, promised him a high position in life, he continued to believe and shone for God even in prison. God then gave him the gift of interpreting dreams. This gift got him promoted to be the Prime Minister of Egypt. In his high position, he was able to save his father and his family from starvation. In fact, he had saved the ancestors of the nation of Israel.

Man may do wicked or bad things to Christians, but God will always make them work together to achieve good. Let us keep His promise in our heart.

Have you ever wanted something you think is good but God did not give it to you immediately? Let us say you wanted to do well in Mathematics. Instead of doing well in the first test, you did badly. Because of this failure, you put in a lot more effort and, if it is God's will, you may score very well.

Was the first failure pleasant? Definitely not. But God in his sovereignty permitted it so that you could learn the good qualities of humility and diligence which you may not have developed if you had done well the first time.

Next time you have a problem, remember this verse.

Thought: God's will for us is always the best.

Prayer: Heavenly Father, You are in full control over everything. No matter what happens to me, help me to understand it is for my good in the end. In Jesus' name I pray, Amen.

BE CHEERFUL GIVERS!

We are taught to give to the Lord by tithing a portion of our pocket money to the church. There may be some of us who may do so unwillingly. Today's verse teaches us that when we give, we are to do it cheerfully.

Generosity does not require giving a large amount but to give out of charity and kindness. God will never overlook even the smallest gift as long as it is given out of love. If you give a large portion of what you can afford, do it cheerfully as a token of love for God and He will be pleased with you.

When Jesus saw a poor widow offer her last two mites to God, He said that she was far more generous than the rich men who cast their gifts into the treasury. Why? Surely their gifts are worth much more than two mites. That is true, but what Jesus wanted to point out is that the widow gave all she had to live on out of faith, so hers was a true sacrifice compared to the rich men who gave out of the abundance of their wealth.

Money is not the only thing you can give. You can give of your talents and time to serve God and others. All our talents are gifts from God. Whether in singing, playing a musical instrument, drawing or speaking, you can always find an opportunity to use them to help others. Or just in sharing.

The next time you have something – whether it be food or a toy – learn to share with others. And do it happily.

Now, we know that there are so many forms of giving. What is important to do is to give with a cheerful heart!

GOD'S PROMISE OF COMFORT

There is an exciting game named 'Persecution' that some children enjoy playing in our church camp. It may sound scary but it is actually a 'hide and seek' game that involves the police seeking to arrest the Christians. There is also a marked place called 'Home' where they can hide safely. A place where we can hide safely from danger is called a refuge. God is our refuge in times of danger and trouble.

What are some of the troubles that disturb us? We may have difficulties in schoolwork or face bullies in school who instill fear in us. At home, our parents may often be quarreling, or we feel they love our sibling more than us. All these can trouble us. Who can we turn to during such times except God?

He has promised in today's text that He is a very present help. That means He is always there for us. The trouble with us is that we do not go to Him in our fear and trouble. We may seek advice from a friend. We may SMS a classmate about it. We may describe our fear and frustration on a Facebook post, but we do not tell it to the Lord!

EVERLASTING LOVE

There have been newspaper reports of youths who join gangs and eventually land up in trouble. Some of these include fighting, vandalism, and other forms of wrong behaviour. Why do these young people join gangs? These youths or kids may come from “good” families, with parents who are well-educated or wealthy. Why then do they join gangs? It is often because they do not find love at home.

Do you have love at home? I hope the answer from most is “Yes”. But some of you may come from difficult backgrounds and may think you do not have love at home. If you then think nobody loves you, you are **WRONG!** Today’s verse tells us that God loves us. And more than that, His love is everlasting.

“Jesus loves me, this I know. For the Bible tells me so”. Do you remember this song? We know God loves us because He told us so. But, do you know when God begins to love us, and whether He will ever stop loving us?

God had shown His love for all mankind before we even came to know Him. That includes you and me. You mean God loves me even before I became a Christian? Yes, God loved sinners so much that He sent His precious Son Jesus to die for them. God’s salvation plan speaks of God’s love. His love is true and is put into action as He had planned.

But more than that, God’s love is everlasting! What is everlasting? That is to last forever! Will God still love me when I misbehave and fall into temptations? Yes, but do not confuse His love and His blessings. When you continue to sin, God still loves You but He hates your sin, so you may miss out on His blessings. However, if you repent and return to Him, the blessings will resume!

The strongest of human love will end one day. Friendship may break up over some misunderstanding; Grandma and Grandpa may die of old age, so they cannot love us anymore, but God’s love, unlike human love, has no beginning and no ending. God’s promise is: “I have loved thee with an everlasting love.” God will never stop loving you.

Thought: Jesus loves me more than words can ever tell.

Prayer: Our Heavenly Father, thank You for Thy everlasting love. Help me to learn to love You more. In Jesus’ name I pray, Amen.

GOD'S PROMISE OF TRUE WISDOM

Do not confuse intelligence with the wisdom mentioned in today's verse. Intelligence is the ability to learn fast and remember well. It is to be able to understand difficult concepts, to quickly reason, or plan or solve problems. The smartest child in your school may be intelligent, but that does not mean he is wise. A child who knows and obeys the Bible is wiser than an intelligent child in school who does not know the Bible.

This wisdom is the ability to understand the things of God. For example, the smartest man who is a non-Christian would not be able to understand the Bible if he has no guidance from the Holy Spirit. He may read it as it were any other book. That is not the way to read the precious Word of God! We need godly wisdom from above. We need the Holy Spirit to show us the truth.

Dear child, pray that the Lord will give you the desire to have godly wisdom so you can understand more of God's Word and will for you. The more you read His word, the more you will like to do so. People have come up with all sorts of ways to manage stress such as meditation, exercise, spas and sports. Far back in history, the Greeks were already using worry beads to relieve stress. In today’s text, we learn that Christians also worry and Peter tells them NOT TO!

Should Christians worry? Actually, we have no reason to. The Bible has the foolproof formula on how to deal with worry. When Jesus died on the cross, He had already freed us from the greatest worry – eternal punishment in hell. Sin carries the death penalty and Jesus has already taken care of that for us. Will Jesus not bear all the other cares of the world for us?

God will take care of us as He has promised. He takes care of even the sparrows in the air and the beautiful wild flowers in the valleys. You are far more precious than all these. Nothing is too small to escape His attention. He cares when you have a headache or a cut on your finger. He cares about your heartaches over

your classmates’ teasing and the red marks in your report card. He knows of your fears of bedwetting, stuttering and pimples. You can share all your problems with Him. Cast all your cares upon God for He loves and cares for you.

And Heaven and nature sing, And Heaven and heaven and nature sing.*




GOD WILL NOT LEAVE ME ALONE

Their acts of faith are all recorded in the Bible. God made them faithful and He completed a good work in them. That means God will keep them and guard them until the very end – that once they accept Jesus, they will be saved forever!

Will He do the same to us? Yes, God has promised in today's text! However, we have to be very careful here. A naughty child or an evil man may think that he can live his life in any way he wants since God has promised eternal life that can never be lost to any person who accepts Jesus. Do you think that is right?

A real Christian will never think that way. A real Christian will be so grateful to the Lord that he will try his or her best not to do anything to displease God. This is not to say he or she will not sin. Because we are in the flesh we sometimes do yield to temptation and sin, while we are on this earth. But the desire to sin will dim as we become more and more sanctified. We will love God and His Word and His people more and more.

GOD CAN USE YOU

This month we will study two of Paul's earliest letters, 1 and 2 Thessalonians. Acts 17:1-15 tells us how the Thessalonian church was founded.

It all started one night, when Paul had a vision of a Macedonian man pleading for help (Acts 16:9-10). Without hesitation, Paul responded immediately! Together with Silas, Luke and Timothy, they hurried to Macedonia arriving first in the city of Philippi, followed by Thessalonica. There, Paul boldly preached the gospel to the Jews in synagogues. Over three weeks, many were converted but many unbelieving Jews also violently opposed them. It got so bad that they had to leave the city by night to Berea.

But the Jews from Thessalonica didn't give up. They followed Paul and his friends to Berea and caused havoc. Paul then departed to Athens and later Corinth, while Timothy and Silas remained in Berea to carry on the gospel work.

So when did Paul write 1 Thessalonians? After Timothy and Silas reunited with Paul in Corinth, he sent Timothy back to Thessalonica to encourage the Christians because he himself was hindered from going to Thessalonica (Read 1 Thess 2:17-18). Paul wrote 1 Thessalonians after he



received Timothy's report of the church and wrote 2 Thessalonians a short time later.

What have we learnt? God carries out His plans through people. God sent Paul, a born again Jew, and his friends including Timothy, a young man. God still uses people today. If you are willing and obedient, God can use you for His divine purposes too.

Look around your social circle, God can use you to a) be a friend to someone in need, b) be a trustworthy help at home, c) be serving in church, d) be His missionary where He has placed you.

Thought: God can use me to be a channel of blessing.

Prayer: Heavenly Father, You use people to fulfill Your will and to do Your work. Please use me to be a blessing to other people. In Jesus' name I pray, Amen.

IS YOUR LIFE CHANGED?

There is no such thing as a perfect church since churches are made up of human beings. Being human, we are still in a body of flesh. Instead of obeying God and living a holy life, our tendency is always to sin and do things our own way. However, there are churches that come close to the mark. The church in Thessalonica was one good example and their testimony brought joy to Paul's heart.

What was the church like? The lives of people changed after they accepted Jesus. Today's text tells us that they had work of, labour of _ _ _ _ and patience of _ _ _ _ (Fill in the correct letters). These are virtues that any true Christian must have. Do you have them? Let's find out what they are.

Faith – this is the faith that produces works. James tells us in his letter that if a person has faith but does not put his faith into action by producing good works, his is a dead faith (James 2:17). One of the works that the new Thessalonian Christians did was to throw away their idols (1 Thessalonians 1:9b). They stopped worshipping idols and worshipped only the living and true God.

Love—the greatest commandment of God. It is easy to love nice people but don't you think it's more difficult to love your enemies or those who seem different from you? Loving others is service to God. This is the 'labour of love'. No longer serving idols, the Thessalonians changed to serving God by showing love to people (1 Thessalonians verse 1:3a).

Hope—What do you look forward to and hope for? A Christian looks forward to the return of Jesus. Unbelievers cannot understand this joyous hope. They hope for the wrong things such as power, position and wealth. The Thessalonians shifted their hope to patiently waiting for the day when they would see Jesus face to face—the day when their faith would become sight! (1 Thessalonians 1:10).

A changed life is the result of genuine salvation. Your name may be on the church roll, but not in the Lamb's book of life. Dear child, have you accepted Jesus into your heart as your personal Lord and Saviour? Jesus is able to change your heart to have faith, love and hope.

Thought: A changed life comes from a changed heart.

Prayer: Heavenly Father, please save and change me from inside out. In Jesus' name I pray, Amen.

CHRIST LIVING IN US

The Thessalonian church brought joy to Paul's heart because their lives reflected Christ living in them. When a person accepts Jesus Christ as his personal Lord and Saviour, Christ lives in him and he becomes a Christian. Just because your parents are Christians, or you attend church regularly, doesn't automatically make you a Christian. You've got to make that decision for yourself! Only with Christ living in us, do we have the ability to live godly lives that are pleasing to God – just like the Thessalonian Christians.

With Christ living in them, they were able to:

1. Receive the W _ _ _ (verse 6). They didn't reject the Word but gladly received the message and the messengers. What is your attitude when the Word of God is taught? Do you receive it gladly or are you disinterested?
2. Follow their 1 _ _ _ _ _ example (verse 6). The Greek word for 'followers' is 'mimetes'. It's the root word for the English word 'mimic.' The Thessalonian Christians imitated their leaders' good example of godly behavior and conduct. Do you see good examples of Christians who follow Christ, whose footsteps you can also follow?
3. S _ _ _ _ _ for Christ (verse 6-8). In turning to God from idols, they faced great opposition and suffered persecution. Are you facing difficulties because you are living for Christ? Continue to stand firm! The Thessalonian Christians faced trials too but didn't waver. Their testimony was of great encouragement to the Macedonians and Achaians. God can use your testimony to encourage and build up someone's faith too!
4. Share the G _ _ _ _ _ with others (verse 8). 'Sounding out' the word of the Lord means to boldly declare the message of salvation. Will you give a tract to someone or bring a friend to church?

Thought: Does your life reflect Christ living in you?

Prayer: Heavenly Father, help me to be like the Thessalonian Christians. In Jesus' name I pray, Amen.

ENTRUSTED WITH THE GOSPEL

Imagine the President or King puts you in charge of the most precious treasure of the nation. He then tells you that your duty is to guard it against enemies and ensure its safety. You are to guard it even with your life! How would you view your responsibility? Would you take it lightly or seriously?

Today's reading tells us we are entrusted with something even more precious than any national treasure. And the One who puts us in charge, is of an office way higher than any president or king in this world. The God of heaven and earth has allowed us, Christians, to be entrusted with the precious Word of Everlasting Life – the only Word that can make a difference beyond this life. Souls can be saved from an eternity in hell simply by believing in God's Word. But what does it mean to be entrusted, or to be 'put in trust' with the Gospel? As Paul writes in verse 4, it is to share the Gospel. This means to tell others about Jesus Christ –so that if a person believes in Him, he may have everlasting life! Unlike an earthly treasure that has to be fiercely guarded and cannot be shared, God calls His children to freely share His precious Word to all. In fact, to be entrusted with the Gospel is to be responsible to share it and not keep it to yourself.

To be 'put in trust with the Gospel' also means that we do not take advantage or abuse the Gospel. Verses 4-6 tell us that Paul never abused the Gospel for selfish gain. His aim was not to be popular among men, or to make big bucks. Paul's desire was only to praise God and make Christ known. Can you imagine what would happen if the guard of a national treasure only cared about himself and sold the treasure? He would be put to jail!

For us, being entrusted with the precious Gospel, we must not sell it by exchanging it to gain favour with man. God knows our hearts.

GOD GIVES US SPIRITUAL PARENTS

Yesterday we learnt what it means to be entrusted with the gospel. Paul never failed to share the gospel and tell others about Christ. He never expected anything in return and only wanted to please God. Wherever Paul went, the gospel was on his lips and seen in his life.

Today, we read how Paul not only shared the gospel with the Thessalonians, but continued to care for their spiritual lives. He didn't just leave them alone after telling them about Christ. Paul stayed with them to build up and strengthen them in the faith. Just like how parents look after their newborn child and pay special attention to the child's needs, Paul also tended to their spiritual health as a spiritual father.

The Thessalonian church was dear to Paul and he cared for them deeply. Paul kept nothing from them. He went all out to teach them God's Word, sparing no effort to encourage, comfort and share his life with the Thessalonians.

Just as a father cares for his children, so did Paul care for the Thessalonian Christians. The Thessalonian Church was a poor church and Paul didn't want to trouble them to look after him. He worked hard day and night so that he could pay for his own living while staying with them.

God continues to give His children spiritual parents today. Like Paul, these are people who care very much for our spiritual health. Aren't you glad that you have such people in your life? They spend much time and effort to teach us God's Word. Spiritual parents could be your own parents, Sunday School teachers, or a more mature brother or sister-in-Christ. These people encourage us in our spiritual walk and desire for us to 'walk worthy of God' (verse 12). We ought to be thankful for them and spend time praying for them and their ministry.

GODLY BEHAVIOUR

Paul described the behaviour of his companions and himself as:

What words would you use to describe your behaviour? Would you think of using these words, too? At first glance, it seems as though this is a very high standard for us to reach. It's like the description of a perfect person without sin! Not so! Let's take a closer look at what each of these words means.

Holy living sometimes gets equated to running away from the world, staying in an isolated place, and meditating all day long. This is a wrong understanding. Being holy does not mean to run away from the world. Neither does it mean to be sinless. Rather, it is to sin less and less in the way we think, talk and act.

To be just is to be righteous, or to do rightly. What is the measure of right and wrong? It's the B _ _ _ _! By reading and studying God's Word, we will know the right decisions to make. But to know is not enough; we must also do.

A person who is unblameable is someone that no one can find fault with, not even his enemies. Paul and his companions were good testimonies in Thessalonica. They conducted themselves honestly before God and man. Our friends don't just hear the gospel from our lips, they also observe if we practise what we preach. Let's pray that they will see Christ in us!

Godly behaviour does not mean that we have attained perfection. Sinless perfection will only be a reality when we get to heaven. Godly behaviour is the fruit of our salvation, of God working in our lives to change us. Can your friends tell if there is a difference in you? If yes, praise God for your good testimony.

Thought: Let others see Jesus in me.

Prayer: Heavenly Father, work in my heart so that I will grow spiritually and other people can see that I live a holy, just and unblameable life. I know that is very difficult, and that is why I need Your help! In Jesus' name I pray, Amen.

IS THE BIBLE IMPORTANT TO YOU?

How important is the Bible to you? Are you doing your Quiet Time out of an obligation to your parents, or has it become part of an everyday routine without much meaning or joy? You may be physically reading the Bible, but is your heart far away and your mind thinking about something else?

This was not the case with the Thessalonian church. When they received the Word of God, they received it as it is—the truth; God’s word speaking directly to them. Therefore, their attitude was to allow the words of truth to sink deep into their hearts. The Word of God started to work in them and its effects became visible to others.

When you read the Bible or hear it taught, what do you receive it as – God’s truth or the words of men? It will show in our attitude toward the Bible. The Thessalonian Christians received every part of God’s Word as truth. Thank God for preserving every inspired word for us today. It’s amazing! We have the very same words that the early church had!

Have you wondered what can make a greedy, lying, vulgar, sinful person repent? Man’s words, punishments, or attempts at counselling may only work for a short time. I remember when I was in school, no matter how many demerit points or detentions that the teachers threatened me with, I continued to break the rules! Lasting change can only come about through God’s Word working in us. This must start with receiving the Bible “not as the word of men, but as the truth, the word of God”.

Read slowly this extract of the hymn “Thy Word is like a Garden”.
What a beautiful picture of what the Bible is!

*Thy Word is like a garden, Lord, with flowers bright and fair;
And every one who seeks may pluck a lovely cluster there.
Thy Word is like a deep, deep mine; and jewels rich and rare
Are hidden in its mighty depths for every searcher there.
O may I love Thy precious Word, may I explore the mine,
May I its fragrant flowers glean, may light upon me shine!
O may I find my armour there! Thy Word my trusty sword,
I'll learn to fight with every foe the battle of the Lord.*

Thought: “...Man shall not live by bread alone, but by every word that proceedeth out of the mouth of God.” Matthew 4:4

Prayer: Heavenly Father, help me to love and obey Your Word always. In Jesus’ name I pray, Amen.

PERSECUTED FOR THE FAITH

The Thessalonian Christians were persecuted for their faith. But God supplied them with the necessary courage and grace to endure the suffering. Have you been teased by your classmates and friends for believing in Jesus? Does your family oppose your faith and threaten to disown you? Persecution could be in the form of hurtful words, threats, the breakdown of relationships, or it could even come in the form of physical aggression.

Dear child, if you are suffering because of your Christian faith, be assured that your experience is not new or isolated. Others have suffered before you (verse 1:6) and others are suffering with you. You're in the good company of the Thessalonian Christians and many others who live for Christ.

In fact, the Bible tells us in 2 Timothy 3:12 - "Yea, and all that will live _____ in Christ Jesus shall _____."

To go through persecution because you are a Christian, is a sign that affirms you are living a godly life. Be not afraid, but stand firm, for Christ is with you all the way. He will not leave you alone.

Another means of help is the support of like-minded saints. That's God's way of encouraging His people and showing His love. No man is an island. Everyone needs friends, and more so good Christian friends who understand the spiritual trials that you go through. Don't pass up on any opportunity to fellowship with brothers and sisters in-Christ!

Above all, the reason why the apostles, martyrs of the Reformation, and so many men, women and children were able to suffer persecution; and even die for their faith was because they desired heaven. Their eyes of faith looked past their present affliction to the certainty of a heavenly home with Jesus. Paul, who was greatly persecuted for the faith, testified -

(Write 2 Cor 4:17)

Thought: Am I prepared to stand up for my faith in Christ?

Prayer: Heavenly Father, help me not to give up when I encounter suffering caused by other people who persecute me for my faith in God. In Jesus' name I pray, Amen.

WHO IS THE ENEMY OF OUR FAITH?

There are no accidents in a Christian's life. God has a plan for each of His children. Anything that happens is appointed by God, even trials and testing. Verses 3 and 4 tell us that persecution is not uncommon to believers. Yesterday, we learnt how the Thessalonian believers faced great opposition to their faith.

Paul had repeatedly told them about persecution while he was with them (verse 4). As they were babes in Christ who were easily discouraged and defeated, he had to warn them from time to time.

But who is behind such persecution? Answer: S _ _ _ _ . He is God's enemy and ours, too. Verse 5 describes him as the tempter. What does he seek to destroy? Answer: Our F _ _ _ _ . That was why Paul desired to know the faith of the Thessalonian church by sending Timothy to them. Let's see how God's Word describes Satan.

1. A L _ _ _ (John 8:44). He is the father of lies; the master of deception. Satan has deceived many into worshipping idols and believing there is no God. In Gen 3:1-5, we read of how Satan's lie caused Eve to doubt God's Word. Satan uses the same tactic today to cause us to doubt God's truths. The lie of evolution is one of Satan's most effective tools in getting people to reject the Creator God

2. R _ _ _ _ _ L _ _ _ (1 Peter 5:8). Satan is hungry and always on the prowl. He and his army of devils don't need to rest. They seek only to cause someone to stumble in their faith. Satan does this by seducing and persecuting. These methods have caused people to also waver in their faith. Paul was aware of this and in 1 Thess 3:3, he urged the Christians not to be moved when they faced such afflictions.

Faith in God is precious and that's why Satan wants to destroy it. Without faith in God, we are defeated.

Thought: Read 1 John 5:4. What overcomes the world?

Prayer: Heavenly Father, keep me close to You lest I succumb to Satan's lies and temptations. In Jesus' name I pray, Amen.

PAUL'S PRAYER

Sometimes when we want to pray for other Christians, we might not know what to pray for exactly. Should we pray for God to bless them, provide for their needs, or for good health and strength? These are all good requests. Today's reading shows us Paul's heart in prayer and gives us additional prayer vocabulary.

Paul had not seen the Thessalonian Christians for some time, and he missed them dearly. It was like a father missing his children and longing to be with them again. Are there times when your parents are away, and they call you to make sure you're doing alright at home? Similarly, Paul, as their spiritual father, cared for them with great affection. He showed this using his fervent prayers for them night and day.

Let's see what Paul prayed for the Thessalonians Christians. We can learn to pray for these for ourselves and others.

1. Grow in faith (v10). Our faith must not stand still but continue to grow. Where does faith come from? Read Rom 10:17. Faith comes by _____ the _____. Pray that we will grow in faith through the study of God's Word.
2. Love to increase (v12). The Greek word for love here is agape. Agape love describes God's love to us—unconditional and sacrificial. This is the greatest form of love because it's a selfless love in action. It doesn't need a warm fuzzy feeling in order to show acts of love. If God so loved us, we ought also to love one another (1 John 4:12). Pray that we will increase in our love for each other and those around us, like God has so loved us.

What is the goal of an increase in faith and love? It is so that God may establish us u _ _ _ _ _ able in h _ _ _ _ _ before Him (v13).

This means to grow daily in our relationship with God and with man; that when Christ returns, He will be pleased with how we have lived our lives. Let's learn from Paul's prayer and pray the same for ourselves and others.

Thought: Prayer can change the one who prays.

Prayer: Heavenly Father, thank You for the privilege of prayer. Help me to pray with conviction and according to your Word. In Jesus' name I pray, Amen.

PURITY THAT PLEASES GOD

Sexual purity is becoming a rare virtue in young people today. We read of an increase in teenage pregnancies, and young boys and girls engaging in sexually immoral acts. So many forms of media invade our minds and hearts that we start to think this is the norm! Youtube, Facebook, other websites on the Internet, TV dramas, pop music, all bombard us with the Devil's lie that wrong is right. It can be quite difficult to avoid such media influences, especially when your friends pressure you to be in tune with all the latest happenings and celebrities.

Turn on the TV and you can easily see kissing scenes. Once shunned, they are commonplace today. Is that the right thing? No! We are to live a life that pleases God, and God's Word teaches us how to do it.

The problem of sexual immorality was also present in Paul's time. What do you think can keep us from falling into this sin? Left to ourselves, we are helpless. That's why Paul exhorted the believers in the following way:

P _ _ _ _ _ God (v1). Pleasing God ought to be the motive of any Christian. Our actions flow from our motives. We must be aware of our motives and examine them. Do you desire to please God or your friends? When we set our motives right to please God, everything falls into place. We will start to pray to Him, read His Word, and apply it in our lives. God will be pleased that we walk according to His will.

By keeping God's commandments, we live holy lives. For example, the world loves to eat, drink and be merry – all of which lead to sin. But God has called us to holiness. We are to live differently from the world, from our unbelieving friends and relatives.

God's commandments guard His people against sin. It is very important to obey God. Will you resolve to have a purity that pleases Him?

A song to sing:

*Trust and obey,
For there's no other way;
To be happy in Jesus,
But to trust and obey.*

Thought: Purity starts in my thoughts and motives.

Prayer: Heavenly Father, help me to keep my motives, thoughts, and actions pure before You. I know that on my own, I'd be unable to live such a life, so please help me, Heavenly Father. In Jesus' name I pray, Amen.

LOVE AND WITNESS

Christians not only have to love one another but also to be good testimonies to the people of the world. Christians belong to the same family and have the same Heavenly Father; therefore, we should love one another. In fact, God taught us how to love. When He gave His only begotten Son, Jesus Christ, to die for us on the cross, it was the best demonstration of love.

Paul exhorted the Thessalonians believers to love more and more. Sometimes, God puts us in circumstances to give us opportunities to show love to others. For example, despite Saul's hatred of David, David loved him and mourned greatly when he learnt of Saul's death. How about you? You can show love to others by being friendly, helpful or offering a listening ear. How about showing love to someone who is not likeable? That is tough, is it not? Again, on our own, we would not be able to do it, and that is why we need the Lord to help us.

Write down one act of love that you can show to another person.

Although Timothy generally had a good report of the Thessalonian church, there were some who created problems in the church because of their idle behaviour. These new believers misunderstood the doctrine of Christ's return and gave up their jobs in order to wait for His coming. They were not busy with God's work but became busybodies instead. They spent their time interfering with other people's affairs and getting themselves into trouble. Their character and conduct were bad testimonies. Paul exhorted these new converts to work to provide for themselves and not to meddle with the affairs of other people. We need the same advice today, not to be caught lazy and idle, but to be busy in working and serving the Lord.

As a student, you should study hard, and give your best in school. Trust in the Lord as you sit for tests or examinations. As a son or daughter, help out at home. Even if you have a domestic helper at home, don't be lazy but be responsible and be a good witness for Christ.

Thought: May our acts of love point people to the love of God.

Prayer: Heavenly Father, help me be a good testimony at home, in school and in church. That is impossible on my own, so please help me God. In Jesus' name I pray, Amen.

CHRIST CONQUERED DEATH

Death is certain, none of us can escape it. For centuries, mankind has been puzzled by death and what happens after death. Man doesn't want to die. Despite advancements in science and technology, the search for an end to death has been futile. Unbelievers have no clue how to solve the problem of death. The prospect that it can happen at any time makes man fearful. As Christians, we need not fear because God has given us all the answers in the Bible.

What does God's Word say about death? Our Saviour conquered death using His resurrection. Therefore, we need not fear death. Once we die, our souls will go to be with the Lord. Paul used the word 'sleep' to refer to the death of believers. While the body sleeps, the soul is 'absent from the body, present with the Lord' (2 Corinthians 5:8). Therefore, it is a wonderful thing for a believer to die in Christ. He is immediately in the presence of God.

Those who die in Christ will have their bodies resurrected when Christ returns (v14). This is the hope of a Christian. Without Christ there is a hopeless end but with Him there is endless hope. What comfort Paul brought to those whose loved ones had died in Christ - his words turned their sorrow into joy.

Let's echo the words of the Psalmist, saying, "Yea, though I walk through the valley of the shadow of death, I will fear no evil, for thou art with me, thy rod and thy staff they comfort me." (Psalm 23:4)

A song to sing:

*Safe in the arms of Jesus,
Safe on His gentle breast;
There by His love o'ershaded,
Sweetly my soul shall rest.*

Thought: For Christians, after death is life everlasting.

Prayer: Heavenly Father, thank You that because Christ conquered death, I am saved forever. I want to pray for some who may not have believed in You. Could it be my parents, or grandparents, or friends. Please help me to be a good witness so that perhaps, they can be led to Jesus because of me. In Jesus' name I pray, Amen.

HE IS COMING AGAIN (I)

Have you spent a long time away from a loved one? If you have not seen a loved one for a long time, would you very much look forward to seeing him or her again? I'm sure you would. Their return would be a most happy event! Likewise, as the day of our beloved Saviour's return draws near, are we looking forward to this glorious event? It's not too far away!

The second coming of Christ is important for us to know so that we can grow in faith and live confidently with hope. Today's passage tells us about the first event that will herald the last 1007 years of this earth as we know it. This first event is called the rapture. We will study more about the rapture in the coming days.



The world around us will keep changing, but Christ is the same yesterday, today and forever. Our future is in His hands, and we have an eternal and wonderful hope in Him.

Thought: This world is not my home, I'm just passing through.

Prayer: Heavenly Father, thank You that my eternal future is safe in Your hands. In Jesus' name I pray, Amen.

HE IS COMING AGAIN (II)

Certain key events will take place before the second coming of Christ. When He comes again, it will not be as the meek and mild Saviour, but as King and Judge. Jesus will come again in full authority to rule the earth with the saints. Let's put these events—before and after Christ's return, on a timeline. Read the verses and fill in the blanks with the matching event.



The first key event is the Rapture. It can happen at any moment. All the signs (Matthew 24:3-24) are pointing us to the fact that Christ will come for us soon. Are you ready? We live each day as though there will always be a tomorrow. Children look forward to playing computer and iPhone games, or trips to overseas amusement parks. Parents want to see their children grow up and have successful careers and happy families. But do we look forward to the Lord's return and are we ready for it? Or have we grown to love the world more than heaven? We will learn more about the Rapture in the next few days.

Thought: Jesus is coming to earth again, what if it were today?

Prayer: Heavenly Father, help me not to love the world but look forward to the return of Christ. In Jesus' name I pray, Amen.

THE DEAD IN CHRIST WILL RISE

Can the body be resurrected once the body has already decayed and become dust? To many people, it is ridiculous. But to Christians, it is possible and brings hope based on the infallible Word of God and our Lord's experience. And what about Christian who may have been eaten by sharks? How about Christians who have died a long time ago? Well, verse 14 tells us that those who "sleep in Christ" – meaning people who died in the Lord as Christians – God will bring them with him!

When Jesus returns in the air, He will give a 'shout' and command the 'dead in Christ' to rise first. Read John 5:28 and answer this question. Where are those people who hear His voice? Answer: _____. Those who rise shall receive glorified bodies, like the glorified body of Christ.

The doctrine of resurrection assures us that death is not the end. The grave is not the end. When the Lord returns, He will bring Christians with Him and raise their bodies in glory. Hallelujah! As 1 Cor 15:55-57 tells us, "O death, where is thy sting? O grave, where is thy victory? The sting of death is sin; and the strength of sin is the law. But thanks be to God, which giveth us the victory through our Lord Jesus Christ." Christ is resurrected. In the same manner, we will be resurrected when He returns.

Some of you may have loved ones who have passed away. Perhaps your grandparents or other relatives. If they were Christians, there is absolutely no need to sorrow for we know they will resurrect and we will meet them in the future!

If you have any loved ones who are not Christians, pray hard for them and share God's wonderful message of salvation with them. If they believe in Jesus, they too will be resurrected together with other Christians when Jesus returns for them!

Thought: Thine is the glory, Risen, conquering Son; Endless is the victory, Thou o'er death hast won.

Prayer: Heavenly Father, I thank Thee for giving me the hope of resurrection when Christ returns. In Jesus' name I pray, Amen.

WILL YOU BE LEFT BEHIND?

Those Christians living at the time of Christ's return will be raptured or caught up to meet Christ in the air. They will be caught up quickly—as fast as the twinkling of an eye. The twinkling of an eye is not the same as the blinking of an eye. When we blink, it is very quick, definitely less than one second. How fast is the twinkling of an eye? Much faster! You see, a twinkle is a reflected particle of light seen in the eye, and thus travels at the speed of light. And the speed of light is amazing—300,000 kilometers per second! So that is how fast Christians who are alive will be taken up to meet Christ in the air.

Do you wonder why Jesus is to meet Christians halfway instead of waiting for them in heaven? Since the speed of their going up is so quick anyway, it would not make any big difference, some may think.

The reason Christ will come down halfway is possibly because He is so eager to meet us! He is in heaven as you read this material, and has been there since He was resurrected about 2,000 years ago. And because He has been waiting, He wants to welcome His people when they rapture!

When the Rapture happens, millions of people will disappear instantly. There will be great chaos and distress. The unsaved will be left behind and wonder what is going on. No Christians will be around. What about you? Will you be left behind?

If you're a Christian, you wouldn't be left behind. But if you're not, you would be. If you're not a believer, would you like to confess your sins and repent? Will you accept Jesus as your Saviour and Lord?

But if you're saved, thank God! A glorious future awaits you! There is a beautiful song that echoes the joy in a Christian's heart, and it goes like this:

*Thank You, Lord, for saving my soul,
Thank You, Lord, for making me whole;
Thank You, Lord, for giving to me
Thy great salvation so rich and free.*

Thought: Will I be left behind?

Prayer: Heavenly Father, forgive me of my sins and save me from death and punishment. I trust in Jesus as my Saviour and Lord. In Jesus' name I pray, Amen.

COMFORT EACH OTHER

What do you do when you need comfort? Some turn to friends, some to the Internet, some to no one. Christians are to turn to God, of course. But in today's text, we are taught that Christians are to comfort each other.

And what does the text tell us to comfort others with? The Word of God!

Dear child, you and I would perhaps not know how wonderful the words of God are until we reach heaven and God shows the entire splendour and power of His words. But until then, let us do what God says, comfort each other with the words of the Bible.

With your friends, do you comfort each other? Or do you irritate each other?

Sometimes we think that being young, we are not in a position to comfort friends. That is not true. As long as you are close to God and have His words, share his words with others.

But to be able to share from the Bible would mean you have to first read the Bible yourself and be fairly familiar with it. You don't have to know it as much as your pastor or Sunday School teacher does, but you do have to be faithful in your QT and Bible study!

Thought: May I comfort others with God's Word.

Prayer: Heavenly Father, thank You for today's text that reminds me to help others, and to do so not with my own words but with words from the Bible. Help me to also be diligent in reading the Bible so I'd know more of it to use when I need to comfort others. In Jesus' name I pray, Amen.

WHEN WILL RAPTURE TAKE PLACE?

When will the Rapture happen? No one knows. Only God knows for He alone knows the times and seasons of future events. How then are we to live since we know that one day, we'll be raptured and will be with God in heaven?

Su Ling was a good girl who studied hard in school. However, she had not been doing well despite the effort put in. In particular, she was weak in Science, and failed in that subject in her final exams in Primary Five. Discouraged, she had been keeping to herself and wondered why God allowed her to have such bad results. Then she read about the Rapture. She thought to herself, "Since Jesus is coming again, I need not study so hard! There is no use in putting in any effort as I'd be going to heaven anyway!"

Is that the right way to think?

Some people may hope Rapture will take place soon for the wrong reasons; Su Ling is an example of that. That should not be our way of thinking. If we are not doing well in any subject, perhaps it is because of the way we are studying. Or maybe it is because there are a few important concepts we have not been able to grasp, and after understanding these concepts, the results would reflect the work we put in.

Instead, we should be looking forward to the coming of Jesus because we love to see Him. Because we want to thank Him in person for the great things He has done for us! However, because no one will know when Jesus will come, let us be faithful to whatever responsibilities God has given us, until He comes!

Thought: Work hard until Jesus comes!

Prayer: Heavenly Father, help me to follow Christ wholeheartedly and not be found unprepared when He returns. In the meantime, may I be faithful in whatever responsibilities You have given to me. In Jesus' name I pray, Amen.

ARE YOU DIFFERENT FROM AN UNBELIEVER?

Are you no different from an unbeliever? If you are no different, then something is wrong. We should be very different from the people of the world. Our Lord said that He is not of the world, therefore His followers are not of the world (John 17:16).

What are followers of Christ like? They are a group of people who are alert to the coming danger in the last days. We are living in this period. We are children of the day, sober-minded having faith, love and hope. In short, believers trust God, love God and feel secured in God. We are well prepared for the perils in the last days before Tribulation comes and can live each day calmly.

We are to be children of light, not of darkness. What does this mean? Children of light have God as their heavenly Father; children of darkness have Satan as their ruler. As Christians, we are children of light, as we have God as our heavenly Father. That is why we are different from unbelievers.

These differences must come from inside. Some kids are nice and courteous, but only when their parents or guardians are around. They appear to be good, but inside, they remain unchanged. As children of light, we cannot be like that. We are to have the Holy Spirit inside, and the Holy Spirit is to change and guide us. Then slowly, these changes may be seen in our lives.

For starters, don't do what you used to do when you were not saved. If you were a selfish child before you came to know Jesus, change. If you were boastful in the past, be humble. If you used to want attention directed at yourself, you now know that is not right, so please ask God to help you change. It is a long process, but all of us must try with prayer.

Don't take God's word lightly. His Word gives you the truth and the truth will set you free.

Thought: Are you different from what you were in the past?

Prayer: Heavenly Father, convict my heart by Your Word and help me to rely on Jesus to live a life that will be different from unbelievers. In Jesus' name I pray, Amen.

BE SOBER!

The main idea in today's text is that we are to be sober, we are to be saved. Paul the Apostle writes that as children of light, we cannot do the things non-Christians do. That includes "sleep" (v 6). Now, what is wrong with sleeping? All of us do that everyday!

The idea of "to sleep" is not a literal going to bed, but for someone to drop his guard. It also means the person is not careful, for one who sleeps would not be aware of things or situations around him. As Christians, we are told to be the opposite—to watch and be sober.

To be sober does not mean you cannot have fun. Kids love fun, and that is fine. But we should not get carried away and do silly things. This idea is not to follow whatever others do. If classmates are unkind, do we follow since "others are like that"? We are to be sober, and to be different. Again, I stress that to be sober does not mean we cannot laugh or share jokes. Whatever we do, we are to see if that is the right thing, from God's view. That is to be sober.

If we are sober, and obey God's Word, we will be saved from bad decisions and punishment.

Sometimes it would appear that being a Christian is "not fun". There seems to be so many things we cannot do. Do you feel this way?

Don't feel that way. If you are close to God, if you read the Bible faithfully on a daily basis, you'll find that slowly, you like to do the things God says! If you love your mummy or daddy, you'd want to please them. And how do you do that? Be an obedient child. Likewise, if we love God, we'd want to please Him and to do the things commanded in the Bible.

Thought: To be sober is not absence of fun but presence of joy in doing what God wants.

Prayer: Heavenly Father, thank You for today's reminder that I need to be sober. I can find fun and joy too, and I will find it while doing things Your way. In Jesus' name I pray, Amen.

CHURCH FAMILY

All of us have families. You have your mother and father, and possibly siblings. Of course, we have grandparents – thank God for them! And then, there are uncles, aunts and their kids – your cousins. A local church is like a family. Leaders in a church have authority over the members, as parents have authority over their children. Some members are rebels, some are quitters and some are weak in faith. How do leaders minister to them? Paul exhorted to reach out to them in love and in patience so as to preserve harmony in the church.

Paul also described the elements of a church family life; namely praying, praise, preaching and teaching of the Word of God and Christian fellowship. Do you see these activities happening in your church? Are they done properly and in accordance with the Bible?

Unhappiness and quarrels happen in families. You may have seen your parents disagree over something and they would need time and space to solve the problem. You may have disagreements with a sibling too. Likewise, such things may happen in church.

Is there someone in church that you may not like? Someone in your Junior Worship class whose actions you may not like? Dear child, because we come into close contact with those in Junior Worship classes, there may be situations where differences arise. Please do not have any negative feelings towards others. No one is perfect, and you certainly are not. Because all of us have faults, all of us need each other to be kind and forgiving.

Remember, your church or Junior Worship class is like a “family” and you should love the members in that group!

Thought: A church is like a family.

Prayer: Heavenly Father, thank God for my church and my Junior Worship class. I pray that I will remember to be a good member of this “family” You have given to me so I can be a blessing to others. Help me be active in the family of God, to be kind and helpful. In Jesus’ name I pray, Amen.

REJOICE ALWAYS?

Irene was a child who loved to brood. Although she was good in her studies, she was never satisfied. If she got high marks, she'd want higher scores. She would be unhappy at the slightest problem, and often pulled a long face. Her mum had been praying for her and one day, decided to share with her a verse. What verse was that? It happens to be today's text. What does today's text say? Rejoice evermore! Mum said—as Christians, we are to rejoice. And not just once in a while, but evermore!

When was the last time you rejoiced? What is the meaning of rejoicing? Is it to laugh and make merry? Is it to tell jokes and slap each others' backs? The idea of rejoicing is not making merry or telling jokes, but always joyful in our hearts because of the wonderful gift of love and salvation God gave us.

But how can we rejoice all the time? What about times when difficulties come our way? Or when we do badly in school? Or when our parents quarrel a lot? The idea is not to be happy because of the problems but happy that despite the problems, we trust that God will still be in control of all things. It is this quiet confidence in a faithful God who will abide and lead us.

Sometimes it is not easy to rejoice because we have problems. You see, God allows these problems to come our way. And that is why the next verse (for tomorrow's reading) teaches us what to do when we need God's help...

Thought: May I rejoice evermore!

Prayer: Heavenly Father, thank God for the reminder that I am to rejoice evermore. Teach me that rejoicing is possible even when times are hard, because I have You! This I pray in Jesus' name, Amen.

PRAY WITHOUT CEASING?

What is the meaning of “praying without ceasing”? Can that be possible? Does that mean we pray all the time? Can we pray when we are sleeping? Surely that cannot be possible? If you have asked these questions, you are right—there is no way we can pray non-stop. There is no way we can pray when we are sleeping.

So what does the verse “pray without ceasing” mean? It means to have an attitude of prayer, to have this dependence on God in whatever we do, all the way. That is how we are to live our lives—to know God is in control, and to always submit to Him and His will. This would mean that, in all areas of our lives, we are to seek His will—to see what He would want us to do. If we really live a life like that, we would be very blessed. We would be 100% sure that God would be with us. Is that possible? Yes, but it will not be easy.

Dear child, pray that the Lord will first grant you the willingness to depend on Him, and then it would be natural to pray more often.

ABSTAIN FROM APPEARANCE OF EVIL

We all would know the meaning of “evil”. That is to do or think or say something that is bad, something that God would be displeased with. In other words, that is to commit sin. But what is the meaning of the “appearance of evil”? It is to be so careful as to not even do anything that is associated with evil or that may possibly turn out bad or sinful.

Is it wrong to dress up as imaginary characters and have some fun? No. But if these characters are scary or ghostly, would it still be OK? From what today’s verse tells us, it would be wrong. With the approval of parents, some children in Singapore celebrate Halloween. This used to be an American tradition, but with more foreigners living in Singapore now, Halloween is celebrated here in some measure. Halloween costumes are sold in supermarkets. The Night Safari had a “Halloween Special”. Some of you may find other children knocking at your front door and asking the “Trick or Treat?” question. Of course, many of these kids do not know better. They just do what their friends do and have some “fun”. But as children of God’s Kingdom, do you think that is acceptable fun?

Of course, not! Dressing up as ghosts or other ghastly characters is surely not what Jesus would expect us to do. Clearly, it would run against the lessons we learned in the last few days: on having a prayerful attitude, or rejoicing in tough times!

Or how about Harry Potter books? These are immensely popular among children, surely they are alright? I am afraid the answer is “No”, they are not alright. Harry Potter is a series of fantasy stories that incorporate wizards, magic, death, and forces of the dark. Worse, the books seem to have more and more evil forces.

Dear child, let us all abstain from or not go near anything that has the appearance of evil. Halloween and Harry Potter are just 2 examples—so please keep away from them!

Thought: Abstain from the appearance of evil!

Prayer: Heavenly Father, thank You for today’s lesson which warns me to keep away from evil, even anything associated with evil. In Jesus’ name I pray, Amen.

WONDERFUL GRACE FROM GOD!

How many girls with the name “Grace” do you know? Surely quite a few! “Grace” is a wonderful name for girls and that is why many parents choose it for their daughters. But what does “grace” mean? Some parents may want their daughters to be graceful and beautiful, and therefore give them that name. But is there a deeper meaning to that word? Of course. For Christians, grace is the pillar of their faith for without the grace of God, none of us would have the opportunity to know Jesus as our personal Lord and Saviour.

Grace may be defined as gifts or wonderful things God gives us, although we do not deserve them. Some of you are more intelligent than others; others excel in games; some of you can draw well; some of you are gifted in languages; some can tell stories well. The list goes on. All these are gifts from God—grace from the Lord. But the most wonderful example of grace of God has not yet been mentioned. What is the most wonderful example of grace of God? It is the gift of Jesus Christ from God the Heavenly Father!

Most of you would look forward to Christmas. Many of you would get gifts from friends and family. It is wonderful to receive gifts, is it not? But the greatest gift of all is the baby Jesus Himself. At Christmas, it is a time of rejoicing for Christmas reminds us that Jesus was given as a gift to all of us. That is true grace in its purest form.

Dear child, what is even more wonderful is that on top of the gift of Jesus, God also gave us other gifts. That is grace. Use whatever gifts God has given you to bless others. If your gift is kept for selfish purposes, God would not be pleased.

If you are good in your studies, help someone who is weak in that area. If you can play musical instruments, help out or volunteer in Junior Worship or school to bless others. In the use of these gifts, remember it is God who gave You this gift so that you'd not be tempted to be proud in any way.

Thought: Thank you Lord for grace!

Prayer: Heavenly Father, thank You for the wonderful gifts and blessings I've received. May I remember You are the Giver, and use them for Your glory. In Jesus' name I pray, Amen.

KNOW THE TRUTH

Truth is found only in God's Word because God is truth. When we do not stand on the truth, we will be easily swayed. Some Christians get easily discouraged when they face trials and temptations. This is one of Satan's tactics to discourage believers.

The truth of God's love and sovereignty can bring a discouraged believer back on track. When you are discouraged, know these truths:

1. (Verse 13a) – God _____ us. Paul described Christians as 'beloved of the Lord'. God saved us because He loves us. He proved this love at the cross where Jesus Christ died for the sins of the world.
2. (Verse 14a) – God _____ us. God prepared His people to respond to His Word. Those who respond to His Word respond to His call.
3. (Verse 14b) – God gave us _____. In the future, we shall share in the glory of God. We are awaiting Christ's return, and His glory shall be revealed and we shall be like Him.

Not knowing the truth in God's Word, one cannot be saved. Truth saves! The truth shall set us free!

There is an old hymn with beautiful words that I'd like to share with you. The words are figurative—meaning they symbolise ideas and things. Have you heard this hymn?

*Thou art the bread of life, O Lord to me;
Thy holy Word the truth that saveth me;
Give me to eat and live with Thee above;
Teach me to love Thy truth, for Thou art love.
O send Thy Spirit, Lord, now unto me;
That He may touch my eyes and make me see;
Show me the truth concealed within Thy Word,
And in Thy book revealed I see the Lord.*

Thought: May I learn and love God's truth.

Prayer: Heavenly Father, thank You that Thy Word is truth. In Jesus' name I pray, Amen.

BIBLE TRADITIONS CAN BE TRUSTED

Traditions are teachings and practices that our ancestors abide by and pass on to future generations. We know of many man-made traditions: no wearing of black clothes during Chinese New Year celebrations; no wearing of red attire during a funeral. Some traditions involve numbers: in Cantonese, the number “4” sounds like “death”; the number “8” sounds like “prosperity”.

In today’s verse, Paul exhorted the church to hold fast to the traditions which they were taught. These traditions were definitely not man-made. What were they? Traditions here were the doctrines taught by Paul, other Apostles and included the Gospel. The Gospel was proclaimed orally by Christ and the apostles and later, was penned down in the Bible. God’s Word was handed from God to man and passed down to future generations. The Bible is thus a Book of historic Faith that was passed down to us.

Deviating from Christian traditions is rejecting the old Book and the old Faith. When man wrongly interprets the Bible, like the Pharisees did, they twist the Word of God. What did the Pharisees do? They made their own interpretations and ideas more holy than God’s teachings. They had a ‘form of godliness’, which means they appeared to be holy, but our Lord called them hypocrites. The Pharisees tried to show off their ‘godliness’ but actually were spiritually dead inside; they were not true Christians. Today, this is common in many so-called Christian organisations such as churches, schools, charity organisations, etc. They try to do ‘Christian’ things but they may not be Christians.

A tradition based on the Word of God is a right tradition. Beware of man-made ones. Many have regarded the Word of God as old and obsolete and say it is no longer applicable today. But old is good. The Bible has encountered countless attacks and triumphed over them. It is tested and can be trusted.

Thought: Love the Bible!

Prayer: Heavenly Father, help me to love the Bible, read it, keep it and live by it. In Jesus’ name I pray, Amen.

PEACE IN OUR HEARTS

After dealing with all the problems of the Thessalonian church, the Apostle Paul aptly ended the letter with the teaching that God will grant peace to rule their lives. Jesus Christ is the Lord of peace. If He is the Lord of our lives, we will have peace in our hearts, and can help to encourage peace wherever we are. What have you done to encourage peace in church?

There may be students or classmates you do not like. Some children can cause trouble, or be unfriendly or unkind. Are you like that? Or do you try to make peace? The book of James says that pride is the cause of many problems. Heart problems must be solved by dealing with the heart and very often, it is a very slow process. How do we overcome this? The antidote is given as follows:

1. Be humble - When you submit to God, God will enable you to overcome the pride and war in your heart (James 4:6,7a).
2. Be alert - Resist the devil and he will leave you alone (James 4:7b). If you carry on creating trouble with people especially in church, you are a friend of the world and Satan (James 4:4) and an enemy of God.
3. Be near to God - Draw close to God, be true and sincere in your heart for God has promised to lead and guide you (James 4:8). Read the Bible and pray everyday.
4. Be careful with your speech – What you say can hurt and break the spirits of other people (James 4:11).

God wants peace and order. Do you contribute to peace or are you responsible for causing unhappiness? You have a part to play! We have come to the end of the study of the two Thessalonians epistles (or letters). There are many lessons, and one of the main ones is that we must be ready, for the Lord is coming soon!

Thought: The Lord is coming again and soon.

Prayer: Heavenly Father, thank You for helping me complete the study of Thessalonians and for all the spiritual lessons we learnt. Help me to love Jesus more and to be ready for His return. In Jesus' name I pray, Amen.
